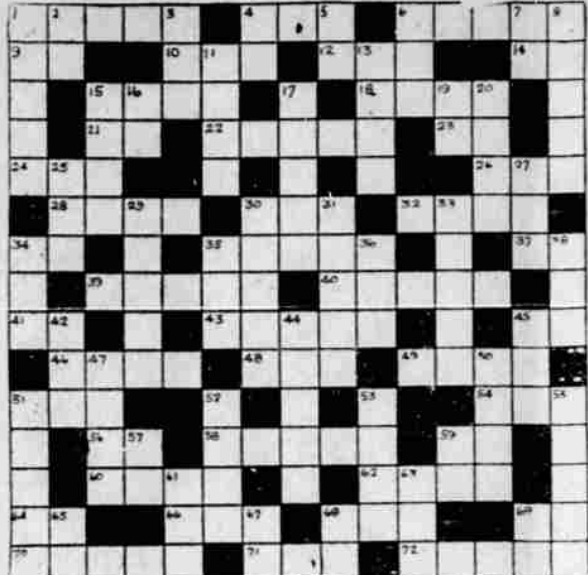

Bodies Pack Morgues. Improvised morgues in a dozen little towns and villages were packed to the doors with long lines of victims of the tragedy who throughout the day had remained uncared for except for the essential ministrations of the hard pressed morticians.
