CARRIED QUARTER MILE
DUNTON, Ill. (By the Associated Press)—Everett Parks said he and his family were carried a quarter of a mile from their home by the tornado.

"I do not remember anything after the storm struck until I found myself holding a fence post a quarter of a mile from the house," Parks related. "I happened to glance over my shoulder and saw my little boy in the air a few feet above the ground, coming directly toward me. I reached and was barely able to grasp him by the leg. I pulled him down and held him until the storm had passed. Then I picked up my wife and my other two babies."

by the next season apparently as many of them were on hand eating up the grain as before.

The new law provides that in a certain district 75 per cent of the land owners can create a pest eradication area by filing application with the county court.

After this step has been taken all property owners in the district are required to poison the rodents. If this is not done the court will do it at the expense of the property owner and collect the cost with the regular tax assessment.

Court Favors Plan.

The county court of Union county has already expressed itself in favor of the creation of a district here should the farmers no longer do it and seems decided.

Two such districts have already been created in Baker county and are now under the regulations described above. Although no definite steps have been taken in the matter yet many farmers who have met at the granges this week have been in favor of the movement and some further action is expected in the future.

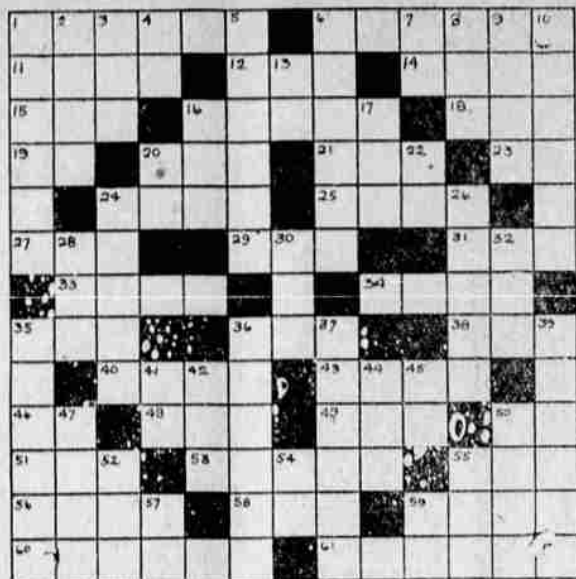
