EACH MAN FINED \$300 BY JUDGE

Two Hundred Fifty Dollars of Total Amount Is Suspended on Good Behavior.

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Movements of Mountain in Colorado Continue

MEEKER, Colo. (By the Associated Press)—Mother earth evidently is undergoing something painful in her "limbs" and in her agony is causing a mountain peak, approximately 2000 feet high, to move slowly but almost perceptibly, by across the Rio Grande valley between Hilly and this town.

With a wave-like roll, the western side of the mountain, which because of past similar actions is called "moving mountain," is shifting from its original base still further towards the west. In the last two days a further movement of 25 yards was registered over a length of approximately a quarter mile. Monday the movement had been over a distance of approximately 75 yards, making a total of 100 yards.

"JAZZ GIRL" TRIAL IS ON THIRD DAY

Long Line of Spectators Awaited the Opening of Court

GIRL GIVES WAY UNDER STRAIN

Screamed Hysterically When Photographers Took Her Picture; Defense Objects to Filming.

SAN FRANCISCO (By the Associated Press)—A long line of spectators today awaited the opening of court in the murder trial of Dorothy Ellingson, "Jazz girl," who has admitted shooting her mother when she forbade her attendance at a night party.

Before the court convened, the girl, in an anteroom, was photographed. She broke under the process and began screaming hysterically.

The defense counsel said they would object to further photographs of the defendant.

INDIANS ANGERED

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore. The case which aroused the "miscegenation of justice" is the conviction of Moore and Purcell for shooting elk.

COUZENS' INCOME TAX TANGLE IS EXPLAINED

By Harry B. Hunt) WASHINGTON (Special)—Assessment of an arbitrary \$10,000, 000 or so in income tax against Senator Couzens to cover a theoretical under-valuation of the 1213 worth of his stock in the Ford Motor Company, may result in a situation where the government, instead of collecting a few additional millions, would have to refund to Couzens, the taxes he had paid as a result of his profit on that transaction.
