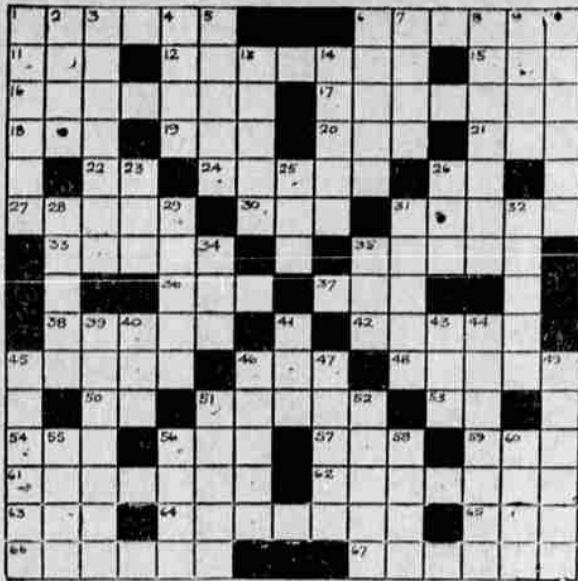

VIENNA (AP)—The number of dogs in Vienna has increased from 40,000 in 1917 to 98,202 in 1921. This abnormal increase is reflected in the attendance of from 20 to 100 persons each day at the Vienna Dogster Institute for the examination of dog-bites received during the previous 24 hours.

TAX PAYMENTS PROVE LARGE

WASHINGTON (AP)—Official reports on the March tax payment indicate to treasury officials that their estimate of receipts for the quarter and for the fiscal year ending next June 30, will be borne out.

The March installment has been calculated at \$420,000,000 and receipts for the fiscal year placed at \$1,600,000,000 in the treasury program. Secretary Mellon and Under-Secretary Winston also had expected that eighty per cent of the March payments would be in the hands of collectors by March 21 for certification to the treasury and their figures, they said, Monday showed that the total on Saturday approximated eighty per cent of the \$420,000,000.

While the trend thus indicated has given the treasury a feeling of security as to the income for the government in the current fiscal year, no one, in the secretary's opinion can tell at this time the full effect of the reduced rates collected by the present law and he regards it as unlikely that the treasury will be able to compute its producing power until after the June payment is reported.

The fact that the treasury will not know definitely concerning the present law has not, however, delayed its plans for going ahead with a study of the changes in preparation for further tax revision next fall. Tax experts now are engaged in going over administrative provisions of the law in an effort to find ways of stopping leakages and are drawing on information gathered by A. W. Greig, assistant to the secretary of the treasury in his recent study of British tax administration.

TURKEY AND BULGARIA LOOK TO BETTER TRADE

CONSTANTINOPLE (AP)—Negotiations are to be resumed without delay at Ankara for the restoration of friendly and commercial relations between Bulgaria and Turkey. Simeon Radoff, the Bulgarian ambassador here, before his recent departure for Ankara, said: "The work of restoring diplomatic relations between Turkey and my country already has made much progress. Important details now engage my attention."

"As neighboring states, Turkey and Bulgaria have many economic interests in common. It is my task to cooperate in the arrangement of a mutual agreement for the furthering of these interests, which are vital to both countries." "Although Bulgaria is only partly an industrial state, she is able to supply Turkey with some manufactured articles, notably textiles. On the other hand, Bulgaria needs many natural products coming from Turkey. Of natural products Bulgaria can supply Turkey with wheat, cattle and sheep."

Air Pilots Look Forward To Balloon Flights in May

ST. JOSEPH, Mo. (AP)—Entries in the national elimination balloon races to be held here May 1 already are pouring into the United States army, with a total of two new balloons, and the Aircraft Development company's balloon, "The Detroit." The Goodrich-Zeppelin company has advised that it will have an entry.

A 150-acre flying field, recently purchased by St. Joseph, has been leveled and pronounced by army officers to be suitable for the event.

Major General Patrick, chief of the air service, has directed a team of two officers at Langley Field, Virginia, to have charge of one of the army's big bags, and Lieutenant Frank McCoy, Scott Field, Belleville, Ill., a technical expert of the army's aviation department, has been here to look into the gas situation. Lieutenant Frank McCoy, Jr., Scott Field, has been detailed to duty in supervising the inflation of the balloons.

Around \$200 is the average price charged for infants in houses where expectant mothers are kept, officials charge. Have private home for unfortunate girls. Babies adopted." She refuses to comment on the charge.

ONE WAY IN WHICH BRITISH PARLIAMENT WASTES TIME

LONDON (AP)—Members of the British parliament who have telegrams in their homes were somewhat startled recently when they ascertained that, because of the instruments they might be deprived of their seat in the house. They are asking whether they have committed a breach of the famous act of George the Third's parliament, which says that any person undertaking a contract with a government shall not be entitled to sit in the house. The telephones here are owned and operated by the government.

The question was brought to light by Captain T. J. O'Connor, himself a member of parliament and having a telephone in his office, who announced that he would ask the attorney general if he proposed to introduce legislation to safeguard members who have contracts with the postmaster-general for the installation of telephone services.

British Women's Clubs, Purely Social in Nature, Prove Failures

LONDON (AP)—Clubs for women are not a success in London, at least those merely for social intercourse, and several have gone into bankruptcy while others saved themselves by the process of amalgamation.
