RENN, Ore.—Although the past winter was one of abnormal precipitation in the mountains of central Oregon, that is not complete assurance that the fire hazard in the Deschutes and Ochoco national forests will be less than in other seasons.

Relative humidity is the primary factor in regulating the degree of inflammability of forest litter, governing the rate of speed of forest fires. It was held by Osborne, who is recognized as one of the leading authorities on humidity in its relation to the inflammability of forests. It was through the efforts of Osborne that a special study of relative humidity was made in this forest district.

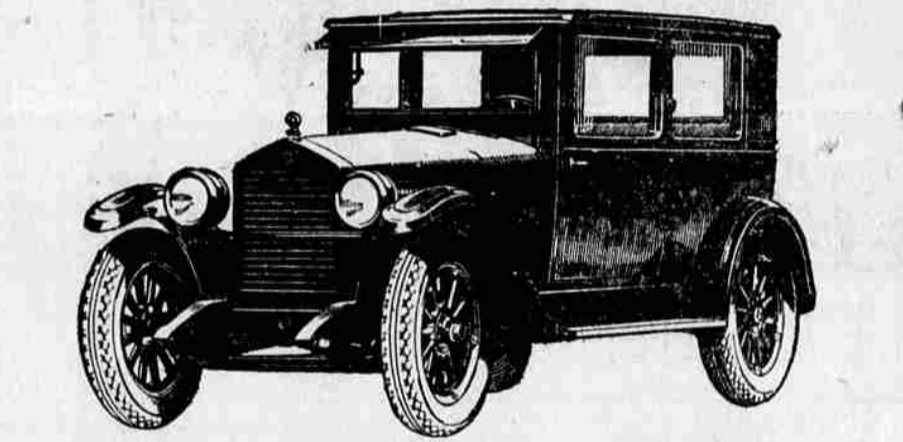
