Wonderful Strides In Medical Science Planned for Future

LONDON (AP)—Twenty-five years hence tuberculosis will be exterminated in the British dominions, or be as uncommon as leprosy is today, Dr. C. W. Saleeby, spokesman for the London Medical Institute, has declared. He predicts that the greatest advance in medical science will be the successful combatting of tuberculosis and cancer, and the reduction of infant mortality to almost nothing.

The last 25 years, Dr. Saleeby says, has seen medical science develop more than in centuries before, but he points out that this has been brought about by very limited number of medical men and scientists, drawn largely from Germany, Austria and the United States. He believes that today all the medical men of the world are vitally interested in perfecting the science of national health and that the result of this international ambition will be a perfect system of combating disease.

The latest methods used to prevent tuberculosis have already provided for a gradual decline in the number of tuberculosis victims for the future and, once health officers have been able to stop the spread of the disease, Dr. Saleeby believes it will rapidly disappear.

The attack on cancer presents greater difficulties, and only the most elementary steps have been made so far toward combatting it, but Dr. Saleeby predicts that another ten years will find science in a position to begin an international movement to eradicate cancer.

Dr. Saleeby, who has been the leading exponent of the campaign to lower infant mortality in England has figures to show that the ratio in England and Wales has decreased from one in seven in 1906 to one in 14 in 1922. He asserts that the ratio will be about one in 22 when the present methods of handling natal cases are in common use.

Duluth Second to New York In Maritime Activities

DULUTH, Minn. (AP)—Although its harbor is closed approximately four months of the year by ice, Duluth is rated the second largest cargo-shipping port of the nation in the annual report of marine commerce of the Duluth-Superior harbor, issued here under direction of Major E. H. Marks, of the U. S. engineer's office.

New York harbor only had more shipping than Duluth last year, and Los Angeles was third, according to the report. Then came Buffalo, Philadelphia, Baltimore, Ashland, O., and Boston Harbor, Mass.

Cargo freight, with a value of \$216,827,517 in 45,416,956 tons, for a season of 225 days, was recorded for this harbor.

The net registered tonnage of the 3,393 cargo vessels which entered and left the harbor during the season was placed at 27,676,722 tons, while the total number of vessels of all classes to enter and leave the port was 9,782.

Tariff Plans of Jail-bird Almost Kill His Wife

VITERBO (AP)—Renato Bottari, a Viterban laborer, recently devised an original scheme to provide for his wife, Nicolina, while he went to jail to serve what he thought would be a one-month sentence. With her reluctant consent, he injected a quantity of Kerosene into her veins, hoping to make her mildly ill so that she might live in a public hospital during his incarceration.

The plan succeeded too well, in that Renato went to jail for a longer stay than he had anticipated, and his wife to a hospital where the doctors barely succeeded in saving her life.

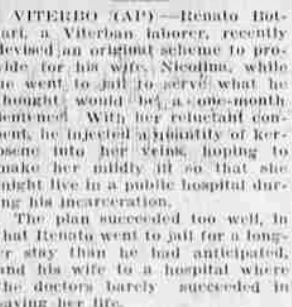
DRAIN MEETS FRANCE IN DIV. LOUISVILLE, Ky.

A. Drain, national commander of the American Legion, arrived here recently. L. T. Henderson, Legionnaire, recalled a meeting he had with Drain at the front in France.

The sight of Commander Drain's empty sleeve recalled to Henderson a night in October, 1918, when he took a one-armed volunteer on a reconnaissance trip in and out of shell holes 15 feet deep through shot and shell of German fire near Barones, France.

Henderson, a private, was driving the tank. As he came out of a vicious shell hole, his engine stalled. When he turned to ask his companion to crank it he noticed his one arm. Commander Drain said he did not expect to ever get out of the shell hole alive, let alone to live and meet his companion of the tank trip years after in the United States.

Gasoline and Tobacco Cheap in Texarkana

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (AP)—While the other people of Arkansas pay four cents on every package of cigarettes they smoke, four cents a gallon on every gallon of gasoline and ten cents a gallon on motor oil burned in their automobiles the city of Texarkana is "sitting pretty."

Texarkana, over on the southwestern border of Arkansas, with part of the city in Texas and part in Arkansas, does not have to pay the cigarette and tobacco tax, and pays only one cent a gallon on gasoline. Even the remainder of Miller county, in which the Arkansas city is located, must pay the taxes.

Murders Increase As Courts Dispense With Death Sentence

BELLEVILLE (AP)—There have been no executions in Berlin since 1921, and it is now being alleged that the number of brutal murders has increased in the German capital because of the disposition of the courts to impose sentences of life imprisonment instead of death.

Berlin has no executioner and the discussions in the papers as to the advisability of restoring capital punishment have brought more than 100 applications from men who want to serve as hangman.
