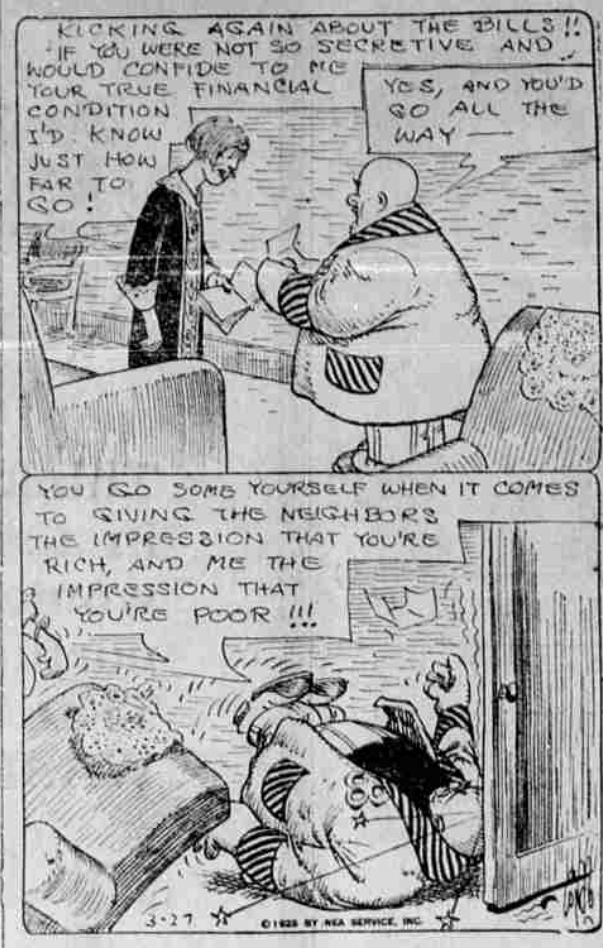

British Engineers Elect Woman to Membership

**LONDON (AP)**—For the first time since its formation in 1854, the British Society of Engineers has elected a woman, Miss Anne Ashbury, of Fulham, associate member of the organization.

Miss Ashbury was a munition worker during the war and within two years became head of a department where large shells were made for the big guns at the front. After the war she established a company which specializes in the manufacture of machinery parts and wireless apparatus.

It was charged that he brought a woman here from Spokane, Wash., several weeks ago, and had been living with her at a local apartment house. A federal officer from Portland was expected to arrive here to take him to that city.

**Mr. Ganoe to Go to Oklahoma.**  
EUGENE, Ore.—John T. Ganoe, instructor in the Eugene high school, has been elected head of the history department in Phillips university at Enid, Okla., and he and Mrs. Ganoe plan to drive there soon after the present year is ended. Mr. Ganoe received his bachelor of science degree at the University of Oregon in 1923 and his master of arts degree in 1924.

**WAR ROMANCES END**  
VIENNA (AP)—It has been estimated that of the marriages hastily contracted during the war, 20 per cent have resulted in divorce. Many of those romances began and culminated, when officers and men came home from the front on short leaves of absence.

**Eugene Man Bound Over.**  
EUGENE, Ore.—George Neal, formerly a Southern Pacific locomotive engineer, who was arrested in Seattle a few days ago on a warrant charging him with passing bad checks, was bound over by Justice of the Peace Wells, being formally charged with obtaining money under false pretenses. His bail was fixed at \$1000, but he was unable to furnish it. He was working at Gardiner when the alleged bad checks were passed.

**Referendum Title Finished.**  
SALEM, Ore.—Hailed title for the proposed referendum measure attacking house bill 413, approved at the recent session of the legislature, was completed by the attorney-general here. The bill increased materially the fees on automobile buses and trucks operating between fixed terminals on state and county highways.

**World Aviators May Visit The United States in 1927**  
WASHINGTON (AP)—A monetary air exposition, attended by prominent world aviators, will be held in the United States in 1927, if the present program of the National Aeronautical association materializes. This association is the American representative of the international organization, which holds its convention this year at Prague, September 19-25. Next year the aviators probably will meet at Bucharest and a move is already afoot to have the 1927 convention held in Washington.

Twenty-six countries are affiliated with the international federation, including many of the South American republics. About 100 leaders in aviation usually attend origins of the federation have been held at Paris, London, Madrid, Rome, Munich, Zurich, Vienna and Stockholm.

**NEW LAW BIT CONFUSING**  
PENDLETON, Ore.—The recently enacted state law which provides that public school pupils may be excused from their school studies for 120 minutes each week to attend a week-day bible school was caused some confusion in Umatilla county, according to J. A. Yaeger, county superintendent of schools.
