## Teachers Declare Visual Instruction Value Limited

CHICAGO, (AP)—Motion pictures as a supplement to existing methods of instruction in the classroom are becoming more popular, but there is no basis at present to believe that the movie will in any way supplant instruction, text books or other such traditional methods of teaching, in the opinion of university which have been experimenting with visual education for several years.

A recent survey made in the United States showed that there were more than 20 state bureaus of visual instruction in educational institutions, 15 of which were located in universities.

Educators generally recognize the value of visual education, but at present the movie lesson is considered more or less of an entertainment period, according to F. Dean McCloskey of the University of Illinois. Prof. Frank N. Freeman of the University of Chicago, in announcing the results of more than 20 experiments in visual education, asserted there was no justification for amounting enthusiasm for the movie as a medium of instruction. He said, however, that the motion picture does have a value, but its use requires the same careful presentation as other subject matter in order to be made effective as teaching devices.

"The practice of using motion pictures as a teaching aid is in its infancy, or in the same place that physical and chemical laboratories were 25 years ago," said William

## JURY PICKED LAST EVENING

### Nine Men, Three Women Selected to Pass on the Competency of "Jazz Girl."

SAN FRANCISCO (By the Associated Press)—A jury of nine men and three women was selected at 3 o'clock Tuesday night to determine the mental competency of Dorothy Ellingson. Judge Landerback then adjourned court until 2 o'clock Wednesday afternoon, when testimony will begin.

Just after court adjourned, the girl, collapsing for the second time within an hour, was caught in the arms of her father, who stretched her on the floor of the courtroom. As she regained consciousness she screamed piercingly: "Jimmy!"

At the time of her arrest last January, she said at first that a mysterious "Jimmy" had slain her mother. Later she admitted the deed.

The sinister course which the life Dorothy Ellingson has run in a few months veered Tuesday, and the 16-year-old girl was turned from contemplation of the penalties to face the madhouse.

Confessed to Murder. On January 13 her mother was found shot to death in the bedroom of their home here. The girl was missing. Two days later she was arrested and confessed that she killed her mother because her mother had objected to the round of jazz parties Dorothy pursued and ordered her to stay at home.

Eight days ago the girl was placed on trial for murder. Tuesday her attorneys having interrupted the murder trial, had started the new jury trial in an effort to prove her insane.

The inquiry into the girl's sanity was touched Tuesday afternoon. It followed a morning of rumors that attorneys on both sides had reached some sort of agreement that might end the entire case. Judge Landerback, however, excused the murder jury until April 6, and directed that the sanity jury be impaneled.

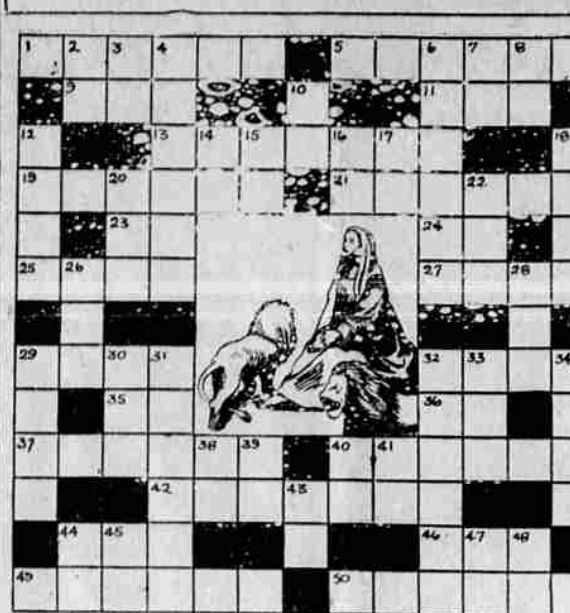
Defense counsel have subpoenaed most of the witnesses whom the state summoned to testify in the murder trial. It was admitted that in deciding the girl's mental condition, the circumstances surrounding the death of Mrs. Ellingson and subsequent developments would have to be examined. Police and others who grilled the girl after her arrest were called in support of the contention by the defense that the girl has become insane.

In the survey made it was disclosed that the 14 university libraries contained more than 7,800 records of film and that 27 percent could be classified as dealing with entertainment subjects, 10 percent industrial, 15 percent literature and the remainder miscellaneous.

## U.S. Educators Aim To Help Phillipine Schools

MANILA, (AP)—The commission of nine educators who have come here from the United States to make a survey of the educational system of the Philippine Islands, expects to assemble facts and not outline policies, according to a statement made by Dr. Paul Monroe of Columbia University, chairman of the commission.

"We have come to survey the educational system of the Philippines," said Dr. Monroe. We shall attempt to ascertain how much it costs per capita to send a child through the seventh grade and how much through high school, and compare this cost with that in the United States and other countries. We shall lay these facts before educational authorities, but we shall not attempt to say whether the appropriations for education should be increased or diminished. That will be up to the local legislative authorities. We have not come to criticize, but to help the islands in educational work."

The commission expects to spend three or four months in the Philippines, visiting public schools and private institutions. Dr. Harold O. Rugg, specialist in tests and measurements at Columbia University, New York, was the first member of the commission to get down to actual work and in the first three days after his arrival had made many observations in Manila in connection with student deficiencies and in the curriculum system.

Regarding the scope of the commission's work, Vice-Governor Eugene A. Gilmore, ex-officio secretary of public instruction, said: "These educational experts will be charged with the duty of making an impartial, dispassionate judgment of what has been accomplished in nearly 25 years since the occupation of the islands by the Americans. The board is to make a careful consideration of what

improvements, if any, should be made in order to have a more effective educational system. It will consider to what extent education has contributed and can contribute to the betterment of the islands and their inhabitants."

In the public schools only the English language is taught.

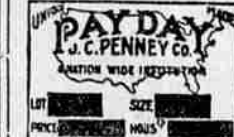
