Radio Chats

(By Powell Crosley, Jr.) One of the most difficult problems with which the department of commerce has had to contend in working out practical rules for the regulation of radio, has had to do with wave length distribution.

Wave lengths in staggered geographical, thus preventing overlap in the area of effective reception.

The recent experiment of the department in attempting to increase the number of wave lengths by decreasing the difference to seven kilocycles proved unsuccessful.

Class A stations of 500 watts or less power were assigned the wave length of 275 meters and below by recommendation of the radio conference and there are in this area 25 possible wave lengths.

Class B stations present a far more serious situation, according to the department.
