K. C. TEAM IN BRISK BATTLE

BARTLETT GYMNASIUM, Chicago, Ill.—There is little doubt in anyone's mind as to which was the feature game Thursday of the National Basketball Interscholastic tournament. This is not if they say Russ Dunn and four other of the greatest lads imaginable wearing the colors of St. Paul, (Minn.) mechanics Arts high school go down to defeat before Westport high of Kansas City, (Mo.) 29 to 28 in a game which needed a five minute overtime period to arrive at the final score.

Dunn, injured twice Wednesday, came into the game swathed in bandages. Injured twice more, he refused to quit until in the extra period he passed out of the picture and was carried from the floor by his teammates. It was Russ who made the tying basket, as well as stimulating his companions to the great fight they put up.

The other games seemed pretty tame in comparison. Wichita, Kan., took things easy despite the fact that Kankakee, Ill., won its final last year and won 37 to 15. Torrington, Conn., fell asleep at the switch and let Uruia, I. A., force an extra period by tying the score at 19 all, but realizing defeat was near, the eastern boys won a place in the quarter finals by sinking two more baskets, the final being 23 to 19.

Wheeler, Miss., and Laramie, Wyo., also went in the next round, the former at the expense of Huntington, W. Va., 40 to 15, while the latter humped off Durham, N. C., 26 to 29. Huntington was picked as an easy winner as the Wheeler team comes from a town of just 200 population and was never coached until this year. Uniontown, Pa., beat the remaining team from this state, Lakewood of Chicago, 29 to 11, while El Reno, Okla., went into the next round over Greeley, Colo., high school, 16 to 6.

The teams winning out in the consolation round were Salem, Ore., West Waterloo, Iowa, Fort Smith, Ark., Southeastern High of Detroit, Monteguma, Ga., Portland, Ore., St. George, Utah, and Springfield, Ohio.

Warfare Declared by Actors Upon Managers of Berlin

BERLIN (AP)—A group of about 100 prominent actors and singers of the Berlin stage have signed an agreement not to enter into contract with any theatre whose management adheres to a plan recently framed by the managerial association, which divides all actors and singers into four categories and stipulates the maximum salary which those in each category shall receive.

Stage folk say they will not be arbitrarily branded as first, second, third and fourth class, according to the whims of the managers, and insist that it is an insult to the profession to try to rob actors of all individuality and herd them together as if they were merchandise.

When the managers announced their new plan they explained that many artists were demanding such high salaries it was impossible for them to meet their terms without increasing the price of seats to a point where the public would refuse to pay.

Puts Snap Into Tennis Balls

LONDON (AP)—A tennis ball filled with nitrogen and claimed to be airtight has been invented by a technical expert of one of the big rubber companies.

INDIANS DETERMINED TO DEFEAT NURMI APRIL 25

LOS ANGELES (AP)—A little squad of Indian long-distance runners of the Sherman Indian school, near Riverside, are training with an intensity and enthusiasm that perhaps they never have equalled before. They have a stiff assignment—the defeat of Paavo Nurmi—and if they do not accomplish their goal, it will not be because of lack of preparation.

The four Indian distance men will meet the record-smashing Finnish runner in the Coliseum here April 25, and they were picked by Charles Paddock and Loren Murchinson, star sprinter, as possessing the requisite stamina and speed to compete against the Finn. Prior to their departure on a trip around the world, Paddock and Murchinson spent much time studying the Indians training and instruction.

The redskin sprinters appear different to the longest race, and they hope that Nurmi will come to something around five miles.
