GUARDSMEN TO CAMP IN JUNE

SALEM, Ore. (By the Associated Press).—Six special passenger trains will be required to carry national guard troops to Medford in June, according to train schedules for the movement issued by Brigadier General G. A. White, commander of the reinforced brigade, which is to have its field training in Southern Oregon, beginning June 12.

2500 SOLDIERS AFFECTED.
 SALEM, Ore. (AP).—National guard troops from all parts of Oregon will move to the vicinity of Medford June 12 for 15 days of field maneuvers, according to train schedules issued by Brigadier General G. A. White, commander of the troops that are to train in Southern Oregon.

Six special passenger trains are provided for in the schedules and two special freight trains will be used to carry machine guns, howitzers, field cannon, trucks, tractors and other heavy impediments of field service.

Twenty-five hundred Oregonians are affected by today's order and the first of these, according to the train schedules, will leave their home stations June 11, whence they will proceed to Portland, Woodburn and Albany to join the special troop trains that are to land them at Medford the morning of June 12, whence they will march to their camp near by.

La Grande in List.
 Cities affected by the movement are: Baker, La Grande, The Dalles, Gresham, Portland, Woodburn, St. Helens, Astoria, Tillamook, Corvallis, Dallas, Lebanon, McMinnville, Salem, Silverton, Grants Pass, Eugene, Cottage Grove, Roseburg and Medford.

Camp orders affecting the coast artillery battalion will be issued later, it was said, but the heavy artillery will probably train at Fort Barry.

United States funds for the Southern Oregon training maneuvers have already been provided, General White said, and all preliminary arrangements made for the Oregon camp. Selection of a field artillery range in Jackson county will be undertaken next week and construction work on the camp site will be started during the present month.

The troops that are going to Medford from the reinforced 85th infantry brigade, made up of the 162d and 168th infantry regiments with attached units, consisting of Battery A, 148th field artillery; Company A, 116th combat engineers; hospital company No. 157 and staff corps troops.

The Jackson county maneuvers will be the first large maneuvers ever held in Oregon and will result in a heavy distribution of United States funds for supplies in that section of the state.

DOOR TO TAX SUITS OPEN
 MEDFORD, Ore.—The door is wide open for anyone to start legal action to enjoin Jackson county from collecting its 1924 taxes, said County Assessor Coleman in discussing the opinion of the state supreme court, recently given in the mandamus proceedings filed against him last November to compel the listing of reductions in the assessed valuations of farm lands and stock cattle as passed by the Jackson county board of equalization.
 According to local lawyers and courthouse officials the decision of the supreme court settled nothing; the assessment out is still on the books and they hold that the ruling gave a "moral victory to both sides" and made a draw.
