Top Floor Tenants Increase
Burden of London Postmen LONDON (AP)—Climbing and descending steps for seven hours a day, carrying a load of 25 pounds is the lot of the average London mail carrier in certain districts, according to a recent investigation, and in Glasgow postmen in the toughest sections of the city climb 2600 steps a day. This is regarded as too much, and the postal workers will propose that the load be limited to 25 pounds and the daily distance to 15 miles.

A notable increase in stair-climbing has come about through the building of more flat houses and the conversion of large dwellings into living quarters for small families.

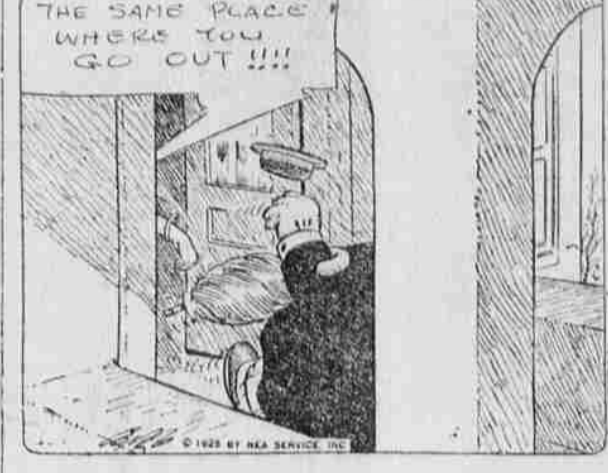
