Wild Beasts of Zanzibar Threatened With Extinction

WASHINGTON (AP)—Appealing to naturalists in the United States to help save from slaughter the fauna of his country, Maj. P. Vaughan-Kirby, game warden of Zanzibar, S. A., has enlisted the cooperation of the American Nature Association.

Maj. Vaughan-Kirby points out to the association that he hopes the coming visit of the Prince of Wales will be of help and that he has prevailed upon the Society for the Preservation of the Fauna of the Empire of England to come to his aid.

The warden explains that in Zanzibar there is a movement to abandon all game reserves, which would mean the extermination of the once magnificent fauna of the sub-continent, and that he has been powerless to stem it. He believes the Prince of Wales will throw his influence in favor of wild life conservation, and the American Nature Association has issued an appeal to its members throughout the world to write to Maj. Vaughan-Kirby and protest against the continued slaughter of the wild animals of his country.

Sherrys Showing "Broken Laws" Today and Tomorrow.

Mrs. Wallace Reid has scored another brilliant success as a producer of photodramas. Her second great timely picture, "Broken Laws," was shown in theatres yesterday and voted an unqualified triumph.

"Broken Laws" is a story of Mother Love and the Law, a vital message to Americans in these days of flagrant law violation and disrespect for the constituted authorities.

But it is more than a vital message. It is an absorbing, enthralling drama, well acted, capably directed and with an adequate background of beautiful settings and rich costumes.

Mrs. Reid's performance in the role of Joan Allen, the mother who through indulgence all but ruins her boy, was a bit of work long to be remembered. Mrs. Reid fairly lived the part, making it a sympathetic role from the start.

In her support were such capable players as Percy Marmont, the patient husband of the "jazz baby" Jacqueline Saunders who did really remarkable work in that role; Ramsey Wallace as Joan's husband; and Arthur Rankin and Virginia Leo Corbin as the young people; and Pat Moore and Jane Wray as the children. There was not a weak spot in the entire cast, and the work of these players had much to do with the success of the photodrama.

The story of "Broken Laws" was written by Aida Rogers St. John. It deals with the affairs of two neighbor families. In each family is one parent who takes the law rather lightly. The effect of this

upon the children is the theme of the story which is carried to a dramatic conclusion in a series of tense, emotional scenes. The courtroom scene alone, where the mother pleads to be punished in the place of her boy, is an epic of dramatic effect.

Judging from the effect upon the first-nighters, "Broken Laws" is going to be a talked-about play during its local run. It has all the elements necessary for a successful screen drama, and is a practically flawless production throughout.

It is a credit to the producer who is attempting to provide worth-while screen plays that mean something and that entertain at the same time.

No one should miss seeing "Broken Laws." It is a play for the whole family, and one the whole family needs.

Soviet Trawlers Land Russian Fish in England GRIMSBY, Eng. (AP).—Baltic-vill, Russia, which last year began organization of a fishing fleet in northern waters, has begun to extend its business to foreign shores.

The first Soviet steam trawler to be seen in a British port arrived in Grimsby recently and attracted much attention, not only among seafaring men, but the public generally.

The trawler brought a load of fish caught off the Murmansk coast. The captain said other Russian trawlers would arrive regularly in British ports in the near future as the Soviet fishing fleet was again getting on its feet and due to recent demands of fishing smacks, was well fitted to supply the Russian demand for sea food, thus eliminating the necessity of buying fish abroad.
