UNUSUAL CASE. Every now and then major league baseball offers a perplexing problem that is wellnigh impossible.

The case of "Dutch" Henry, southpaw, is a glaring example. Henry, for several years the property of the Brooklyn club of the National league, was recently traded to Indianapolis for the veteran Jess Petty.

In the minors, Henry has always been a sensational performer. For some reason he has never been a consistent winner in the big show. Henry was originally picked up by Lee Fohl, then in charge of the St. Louis Browns, but was allowed to drift elsewhere.

During the past two years he has been sent to the Southern Association by Brooklyn on option. Getting a chance to work regularly he was the big noise in the south east year.

As I recall it one season he was something like 20 and lost only four games, while last year the figures resembled 10 wins and only two defeats.

Thus in 34 games in the south, Henry pitched better than any ball. Had he not been the property of the Brooklyn club, major league scouts would have been fighting for his services with six checks as their weapon.

Despite such a phenomenal showing, Brooklyn before the four games, while last year the minors a most promising youngster for a fading veteran.

The fact that Brooklyn needs pitching to be up there, plus the belief of Manager Robinson that Petty's long experience would lead him to jump in as a regular, no doubt actuated the shift.

While looking the Brooklyn club over at Clearwater, Fla., I had a long chat with Henry. He didn't appear quite satisfied with his berth. Perhaps that isn't something to do with the trade.

Henry told me that it was the management's belief that his last ball wasn't good enough to get by.
