Sister Mary's Kitchen

BY SISTER MARY

Breakfast. Stewed prunes, cereal, thin cream, fish hash, toasted corn bread, milk, coffee.

Luncheon. Luncheon veal, French endive with French dressing, brown bread, rhubarb strudel, white cake, milk tea.

Dinner. Broiled lamb chops, baked potatoes, creamed spinach, banana and peanut salad, peach cabinet pudding, whole wheat bread, milk, coffee.

A child under school age should be served a small piece of the cake and a dish of plain stewed or canned fruit for his luncheon dessert in place of the spherice. His salad should consist merely of very finely minced endive without the dressing.

With the exception of the banana and peanut salad, a child four years old may have all the rest of the dinner suggested.

You will like this "goucheon veal" concoction. It suggests a possibility for "left-overs" of any kind of meat worth trying out.

Luncheon Veal. One pound veal steak, 1/4 cup flour, 1 scant teaspoon salt, 1 slice onion, 1/2 teaspoon pepper, 2 cups boiling water, mashed potatoes.

Trim veal carefully and cut into small pieces. Mix flour and salt and roll meat in mixture. Melt butter and lard in a hot frying pan. Add slices of onion and prepared meat. Brown meat quickly on both sides. Remove onion and add boiling water. Cover closely and cook one hour over a low fire or in a moderate oven. Remove meat from gravy and chop meat very finely. Combine with the gravy. Arrange meat and gravy mixture in ramekins and cover with well-seasoned and well-beaten hot mashed potatoes. Don't spread the potatoes smoothly over the meat, rather drop lightly from the spoon. Put into a hot oven to brown potatoes and reheat meat.

British Exempt from Income Tax on Horse Race Winnings

LONDON (AP).—Winnings from bets on horse races, if the winner is not a professional bookmaker and places his bets at starting prices only, are not subject to the British income tax, the King's Bench Division of the law courts ruled last recent case.

The income tax commissioners had sought by law to recover a tax on \$1500 from a man whose livelihood was alleged to depend upon his winnings from bets, apart from a certain amount of interest on his bank deposit. The defendant denied that he was a professional bettor, although he admitted he lived largely upon his winnings.
