## Sweden to Draw Many From Distant Lands

GOTHENBURG (AP).—Merchants, proletarians and athletes from the United States and other countries, will this spring and summer journey to Sweden to attend trade fairs, a religious gathering and sporting contests.

The first of these will be an industrial exhibit to be held in Gothenburg May 4-10, at which the best products of Swedish industries, handicraft and commerce will be shown to visitors from many countries. The second occasion for many internationalists to meet in Sweden will be the Baltic Trade Fair, which has been arranged in Stockholm for June. To this all the countries bordering on the Baltic Sea, except Germany, have been invited to send exhibits.

For churchmen the outstanding event of the year will be the universal conference on Christian Life and Work to be held in Stockholm from August 19-26. From the United States alone will come about 150 delegates. Every country in Europe, as well as India and the Far East, will be represented.

Vikta Cathedral, on the Island of Gothland, will celebrate the 700th anniversary of its foundation in July, and American athletes will compete in international games at the Stockholm stadium this summer.
