PIRATES GET EIGHT GAMES IN HOME CITY

Official Blue Mountain League Baseball Schedule Drawn Up for Summer Season.

The two opening games on the Blue Mountain league schedule will be played on the other side of the mountains, Sunday. The Pirates will journey to Walla Walla and the Baker City will display their talent against the Pendleton Buckaroos on that date.

La Grande has eight home games scheduled. The first will be on April 26th against Pendleton. The Pirates will play but one game away from the home lot before appearing in harness here. One game will be at Walla Walla next Sunday and on the following week the Buckaroos are scheduled to play the Pirates here.

A large delegation of fans plan to accompany the team to Walla Walla for the league opener and every indication points to a bang up game right from the start.

The La Grande battery has not been definitely announced yet. Jeff Hartman is on hand and may be used with a new catcher although he is rated on the club as relief hurler.

Each team in the league will play 15 games. Walla Walla and La Grande have eight home games and seven trips and Baker and Pendleton will play seven games on the home lot and eight away.

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Stanislav Zyzsko of New York Wednesday night regained the world's heavyweight wrestling title which he formerly held by defeating Wayne (Big) Munn, Nebraska giant, in two straight falls.

The first fall came in eight minutes, 11 seconds and the second in four minutes, 53 seconds. In pinning Munn's shoulders to the mat the first time Zyzsko used a forearm hold. The second time he employed a free arm and hammer.

GREAT BATTERERS
Tris Speaker of the Cleveland Indians has won much of his baseball fame because of his spectacular fielding ability. But as a matter of fact he is equally efficient at the bat.

Speaker has a beautiful style at the plate. His stance is most graceful and he takes a cut at the ball that is rhythmic itself. An opposing pitcher, Speaker looks good when you strike him out.

During the course of the season I get many written queries as well as personal asking to explain what power the great hitters of the game possess that is lacking in the ordinary player.

Much natural ability is, of course,

the outstanding feature of every great batter. He must have a good eye, power to his swing and judgment in getting the ball to hit. All these things make for perfect coordination.

Also the element of luck plays a certain part in the hitting average of every player. Often hard-hit balls going directly at some outsider, result in out, while some weakly hit ball just escapes the catcher of several fielders.

Every ball player, however, knows when he is hitting the ball properly regardless of whether it goes safe or not.

TIMING BALL.
Proper timing of the ball is most essential. This comes with perfect coordination of eye and muscles. When a ball is properly timed it will travel. If it goes directly in to the hands of a waiting fielder it must be accepted as the "break" of the game.

While Tris Speaker may have some of the ability that featured his general play of 15 years ago, it is still a treat to watch him go back after a long fly or take a healthy cut at the ball.

The referee stopped the fight in the fourth round after Baker had hit the canvas eight times.

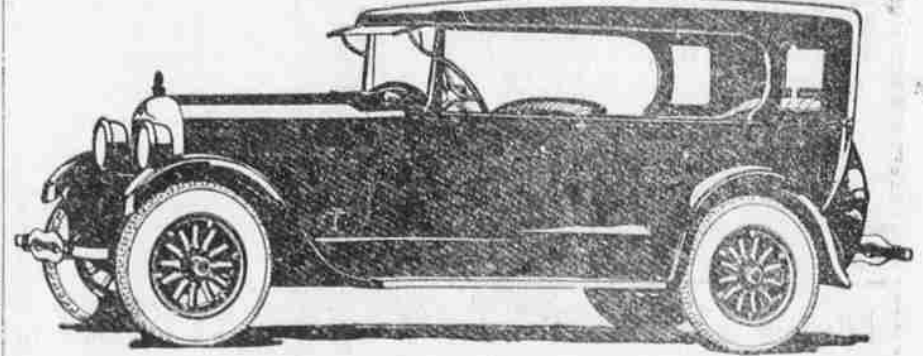
