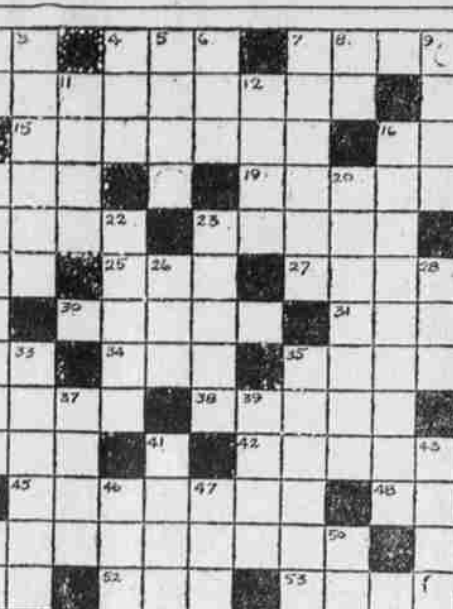

The said recommended by the undersigned for general use throughout the season consists of and is prepared as follows: strychnine (powdered alkaloid) 1 ounce, Bicarbonate of soda (baking soda) 1 ounce, Saccharine 1-2 ounce, Heavy Corn Syrup 1-4 pint, Thin Starch Paste 1/2 pint, Glycerine 1 tablespoonful, Table Salt 1 tablespoonful. Mix thoroughly in a clean vessel 1 ounce of powdered strychnine (alkaloid), 1 ounce of common baking soda, and 1-2 ounce of saccharine. Over this pour 1/2 pint of thin hot starch paste and stir well. The starch paste is made by dissolving 1/2 cup of heavy corn syrup in 1 cup of boiling water and 1/2 cup of cold water, which is then added to 1/2 pint of boiling water. Boil and stir constantly until a clear thin paste is formed. Stir in 1/4 pint of
