NEW YORK (AP)—For women's national golf champion in near future New Jersey presents a seventeen-year-old high school girl who, for lack of competition in her own sex, often plays with men and defeats them.

The first thing the gallery at a tournament notices when Miss Maureen Orcutt is on the first tee is her bobbed blonde locks, tied with a ribbon of flaming red or other hue. Then the distance that the ball goes astounds all other considerations. Her hitting is amazing, and has been so since she started to play the game as a little girl.

Kid Drove 225 Yards. At the woman's national tournament at the Hollywood Golf club, Deal, N. J., four years ago, a mile of an entrant who wore half-hose and skirts the shortest which was determined by her size and age, and not by fashion, stepped up to the first tee in the qualifying round and caused a chorus of surprised "ahs" when she smashed the ball 225 yards, a good drive for any golfer without regard to sex or age.

Many good woman golfers have difficulty with their irons, not having the firmness of wrist essential for a crisp and successful shot. No so Maureen. The length she gets with irons would not be at all had for a professional. The malleable iron is her favorite. Often she has reached a green more than 400 yards from the tee with a drive and an iron. When her short game becomes as good as her long game, experts say, she should be unbeatable.

Mother Orcutt is a golfer, or rather was before she helped teach the art to Maureen. Mrs. Orcutt just had been runner up in the club woman's championship of her sex when she and Maureen played an honest-to-goodness match at a club. Maureen won. Then mother gave up the game, except for chaperoning Maureen to tournaments, supervising her practice and reminding her, if she is beaten, that she is young and another year is coming.

CAPABLE SUBS. Major league managers are going in strong for capable reserves this year.

I have no doubt but that the club the Washington club found itself in during the world series when Eckhardt was injured, is the cause of it.

Lack of even speed substitutes almost cost Washington baseball's greatest honor, the world's championship. It seemed almost ridiculous that a player whose name should be so readily recalled.

Several of the substitutes who broke into the 1924 world series were far removed from major league caliber, yet figures prominently in the minds of the year.

In every camp I visited during spring training, the managers pointed with pride to their spare bunch of reserves.

The theory that a team is no stronger than its substitutes is apparently about 92 per cent truth.

PINCH HITTERS In speaking of reserves, I should like to mention a player to have a special mention. The athlete who can hit in the pinch.

The pinch hitter is one of baseball's most valuable assets. As a matter of fact, a club lacking in at least one capable right-hander and left-hander for pinch purposes, is working under a handicap.

That one fault played havoc with the New York Yankees in their close game last year. The club had plenty of left-handed pinch hitters but barely a good right-hander.

The role of pinch hitter is, perhaps, the toughest in baseball. Incidentally a manager always lays himself open to the second-guesser when he makes a shift in his lineup.

GIANTS STYLE In all probability no club in the majors uses the sacrifice less than the New York Giants.

In the spring games I watched between the various major league clubs, I noted that Manager McGraw leaned strongly to the hit-and-run.

I have observed that any time the Giants used the hit-and-run play the batsmen seemed to try to hit the ball to right field. He didn't always succeed but the effort was made.

After one of the games I made mention of the fact to one of McGraw's stars and he admitted that the players in so doing were working under managerial instruction.

Here is the very interesting information I gathered as the result of my observations, also revealing one of the reasons for the Giants' success.

CLIFF PAINTING STUDIED THE DALLES, Ore. - Arrangements for a community cliff-painting party are in progress along the Columbia river between The Dalles and the Deschutes April 18 were made by J. R. Horner, professor of history and anthropology at Oregon Agricultural college.

Interested persons from all parts of Oregon will be in attendance, including Governor Pierce, according to Professor Horner. Pictures will be taken on the stone cliffs at Big Falls, made with a point of sand starting on the rock face, stone carving and other relics of a rock field to antedate the Indian, will be visited and explained by Dr. Horner, who is seeking to arouse public interest to the extent that further destruction of the paintings and carvings may be stopped.

These cliff paintings should be one of the major attractions of the upper Columbia river highway, Dr. Horner believes, instead of being virtually unknown as at present.

WHISKY KEPT UNDER GUARD

WASHINGTON, (AP)—There are 20,000,000 gallons of prohibition whisky now in storage in the United States, under government supervision, and its owners, most of whom are caught with the stock on their hands when national enforcement became effective, can not dispose of it except as the government may direct.

Prohibition Commissioner Hayden believes the government should purchase the whisky, most of which is stored in 28,000,000 gallons in Kentucky. Legally, he points out, there has been no whisky manufactured in this country since January 1, 1922, and the stock now on hand, being gradually expended for medicinal purposes, Mr. Hayden estimates, will be sufficient only for another seven years.

About 1928, four years before the present whisky stock is exhausted, it is expected that the government will authorize the manufacture of whisky, so that four-year-old spirits may be available as medicine at the time the pre-prohibition supply becomes exhausted. Consumption by prescription is now about 1,750,000 gallons annually. Mr. Hayden says, care must be taken to conserve 20,000,000 gallons of whisky before prohibition.

There is no real demand for rum, officials of the prohibition unit declared, and the 2,900 barrels of this product now on hand will likely be exported.

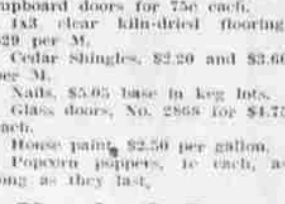
