**AGGIES MAKE FINE RECORD**

**OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, Ore. (Special)**—With a record of three victories, one tie, one defeat, and three no decision meets, the Aggie debaters have completed their eastern invasion and are on their way west for their last contest which will be with Washington State college April 25.

The last meet of the eastern schedule was with Syracuse university where Robert Kerr and Frank Deffault upheld the affirmative of the supreme court question and won a 2 to 1 decision, outclassing their opponents in knowledge of the subject and delivery, according to reports of the debate.

**Loss of Dirigible Traced To Impact of Radio Waves**

**TOKIO (AP)**—Dr. T. Terada, science professor in Tokio university, says that the destruction of the dirigible SRS last March with the loss of her crew was caused by a broadcast radio wave.

Dr. Terada was a member of the board appointed to investigate the explosion and after it had ended its labors without finding a theory, he continued his experiments. Coating a miniature of the dirigible with the aluminum paint that was used on the SRS, he found that radio waves directed against it produced sparks measuring nearly an inch, and while he has not fully disclosed the nature of the experiment and its results, he expressed his conviction that he has found the cause of the disaster.
