**BRITISH TOLD OF AMERICA**

LONDON (AP)—The middle-class, stay-at-home Britons are being encouraged to get a feeling of the new world this coming summer during their regular annual holidays. Vacations for the majority of the white-collared workers who inhabit this island amount to 21 days. Heretofore the middle classes have counted on no further holiday excursions than jaunts to the country just across the channel; relatively few got so far away as Italy.

And now the steamship companies, for a mere 28 pounds, less than \$230, offer to take them to that fabled city of New York, which they rapidly for a few days around the American metropolis, show them a few spots in Canada, and deliver them back home, all within those precious 21 days of summer holidays.

It is a vision that to many of the stay-at-home seems too good to be true. Every day, almost, they read of the wonders of the new world, and their eyes are gorged with the splendor and glitter of the new world each time they go to the movies. Their appetites are whetted for this wonderful by the annual visits of American golfers and tennis stars, and the home coming tales of the official stream of British tourists, British lecturers and British actors whose favorite pastime would seem to be gathering in greenbacks that grow so plentifully in that rich-republic across the sea, whose inhabitants have a perfectly astonishing eagerness to pay people fabulous sums to lecture to them, or otherwise amuse or instruct them.

Up to now the middle-class folk who stay at home never have even seriously thought for a minute of America as a possible place for merely a holiday visit, in the sense that so many Americans seem to regard Europe. Leisured Britons visit America purely on pleasure bent, and the trading travelers of England and Scotland occupy a good many cabins on every ship bound for New York. But, except for those, most of the Britons who set out for America in the past were either the poor who crossed the Atlantic to make a new start and a new home, or else those at roving dispositions who wandered everywhere.

South America looks like a good place for such trade activity, roads being few and very bad. However, they suit South Americans, who aren't in a hurry, as North Americans are, if the roads are too bad to travel one day, a later day does just as well.

Besides, the population is too thin to afford much road work. It is explained that roads must come first and then the country will fill up, like the United States, the answer is, "That's the very thing we don't want"—also the very thing No. 6 Americans seem unable to understand or even believe.

While the American Cotton Manufacturers' association was in convention here, leading delegates called on President Coolidge to tell him about the country's industries want higher tariff rates. **MONEY RATES MADE CLEAR**

NEW YORK (AP)—Newsprint throughout the country publishing daily New York money rates on call and short-term loans, often are asked by readers where they can get some of the money Wall street is loaning at, say four per cent, when local banks are asking six.

A leading metropolitan banker here offers in reply that this lower-priced money is not available to the general public. It is put out under special conditions which he sums up as "wholesale versus retail." Wall street, he explains, can afford to make a wholesale price, such as four per cent money requirements, because it makes those loans only in wholesale amounts with \$100,000 as a minimum.
