Sister Mary's Kitchen

Breakfast. Orange juice, cereal, thin cream, waffles, maple syrup, milk, coffee.

Luncheon. Baked codfish, brown bread and butter sandwiches, molasses and onions, orange cake, milk, tea.

Dinner. Frieded veal cutlets, rice potatoes in cream sauce, buttered asparagus, pineapple and cheese salad, floating island, rolled oats, bread, milk, coffee.

One cup flaked codfish, 4 cold boiled potatoes, 1 1/2 cups canned tomatoes, 1 small onion, 2 tablespoons butter, 1/2 tablespoon flour, salt and pepper, coarse stale bread crumbs.

Soak fish in warm water until soft. Drain. Slice potatoes. Place alternate layers of fish and potatoes in a buttered baking dish. Sprinkle tomatoes and onions for 15 minutes. Turn through a coarse sieve. Melt butter, stir in flour and slowly add hot tomato sauce, stirring constantly. Season with salt and pepper and pour over fish in baking dish. Sprinkle with coarse crumbs, dot with bits of butter and bake in a hot oven until crumbs are brown.

Orange Cake. One-third cup butter, 1 egg, sugar, 2 eggs, 1/2 cup milk, 1 1/2 cups flour, 2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder, few grains salt, 1/2 teaspoon vanilla.

Cream butter and beat in half the sugar. Beat yolks of eggs until light and beat in remaining sugar. Add to first mixture and beat well. Mix and stir flour, salt and baking powder and add alternately with milk.
