**COLOGNE, Germany (AP)**—Cologne soon will have the highest office building on the continent of Europe. Though it will be only 12 stories high, the German press speaks of it as a "sky scraper on the American model," and tourists travel across the city to view it.

The new building, however, bears little resemblance to its American counterparts. It is devoid of all ornament, and reared in heavy, red brick. It is more like a forbidding medieval castle than the artistic structures which make up the famous skyline of New York's famous front.

The men decided to take over the business when it was announced recently that the plant was to be closed because the owners had been losing heavily financially for many months. The experiment will continue for three months.

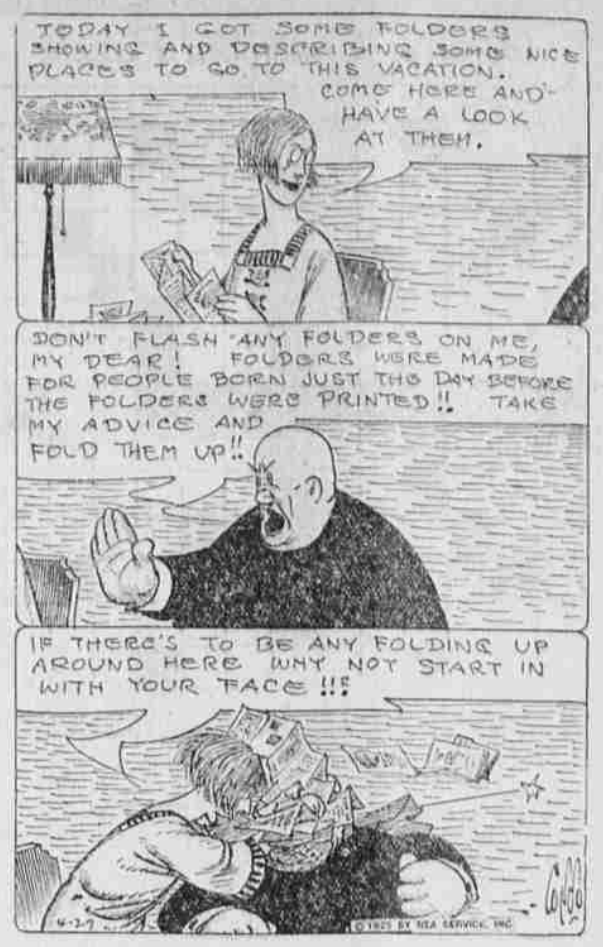

**"Let 'Er Buck" Coming to Star Wednesday.**

It is contended for "Let 'Er Buck" Universal-Gibson special coming to the Star theater Wednesday with Foot Gibson as star, that never before has a picture been made in such an elaborate atmosphere. It is not contended that other pictures have not cost more to produce, but it is contended that if extra settings used in connection with the filming of this picture had been paid for as part of the expense the picture would have cost more than any other picture ever filmed.

And all this because "Let 'Er Buck" was made in Pendleton, Oregon, while that city's famous annual Tour-Top was in progress. Foot Gibson is a favorite among the riders who assembled at Pendleton, for in 1912 he won the grand annual championship there. Further, several of the Universal Ranch Riders in the company are old time participants in the Tour-Top, sports and they were entered in a number of the events on the program.

### Clergyman Acts As Technical Director of Film.

The wedding sequences in "Behold This Woman," the J. Stuart Blackton Vitaphone production, which will be shown today and tomorrow, were filmed under the supervision of an ordained clergyman.

Mr. Blackton believes that in producing pictures great care should be exercised to make each detail absolutely correct. His attention has been drawn many times to discrepancies in detail which often detract from the entertainment value, and he therefore has always surrounded himself by authorities when making a film.

Inaccuracies in wedding and church ceremonies have always annoyed him on the screen, and so, when he was producing "Behold This Woman," he engaged the Rev. Neal Todd, pastor of Holleywood's "Little Church Around the Corner," generally known as the Motion Picture Players' church, to supervise the technical details of the wedding. The Rev. Mr. Todd is one of the clergymen who desire to have ecclesiastical affairs correctly portrayed from the screen and to that end has selected delegates into the ranks, rituals and dogma of the other creeds of the United States. He is considered an authority on religious subjects, and in addition knows a great deal of the technique of motion picture production.

**WASHINGTON (AP)**—The great fire-staff that has topped the heights of Arlington, in front of the Custis-Lee mansion, ever since the national cemetery was established shortly after the Civil war, is to fall before the modernizing conception of harmonious landscape.

The National Fine Arts Commission has ruled that the 100-foot shaft doesn't blend with the beauty of the natural surroundings of the cemetery, and the war department is contracting for its removal. It will be preserved, however, by erecting it on the Fort Myer Reservation a mile or so away.
