Pendleton Round-Up Captured by Camera.

The Pendleton Round-Up, biggest and most colorful of the sports held in this country each year, "Let 'er Buck," in the background for Foot Gibson's rodeo special coming to the Star Theatre next Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Many of the daily events, with championship riders endeavoring to conquer horns possessing nationwide reputations for kicking viciousness, other roping stunts and others in thrilling bullroging stunts.
