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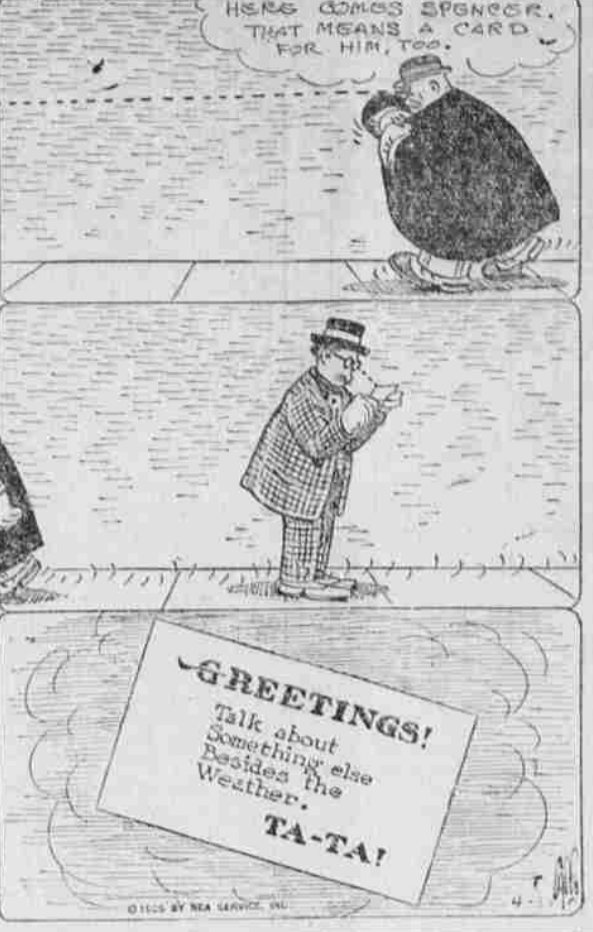

West Point Participates in Silent Drama.

"Classmates," the first National production starring Richard Barthelmess at the Arcade theatre, presents West Point for the first time on any screen as the background for a silent drama.

The United States Military Academy has been filmed for the first time. The famous parade of the West Point cadets, pronounced the best drilled body in the world, have evoked cheers in theatres throughout both hemispheres. The Military Academy officials, however, have always refused to permit the use of the West Point cadets for a photography story. They felt that the Academy, sacred to the finest traditions of America, must be held as a thing apart.
