UNITARIANS TO HOLD SESSION

BOSTON (AP)—Many distinguished Unitarians from Europe will participate in the celebration in this city during the week of May 16 of the 100th anniversary of the organization of the American Unitarian association.

C. Sydney Jones of Liverpool, former president of the British and Foreign Unitarian association, will speak at the annual meeting of the Unitarian Laymen's League May 21.

The first event of centenary week will be the centenary sermon to be preached at Sanders theater at Harvard university on Sunday, May 10, by Dr. Paul Rogers Frothingham, pastor of the Arlington Street church, Boston.

Dr. Charles W. Eliot, president emeritus of Harvard university, will be the principal speaker at the meeting of the Unitarian-Temperance society on Monday.

Dr. George W. Kitchin of New York will be one of the speakers at the meeting of the Unitarian Social Service Council on the same day.

Dr. Eliot's son, Dr. Samuel A. Eliot, who has been president of the American Unitarian Association for one-fourth of its existence, will preside at its annual meeting on Tuesday.

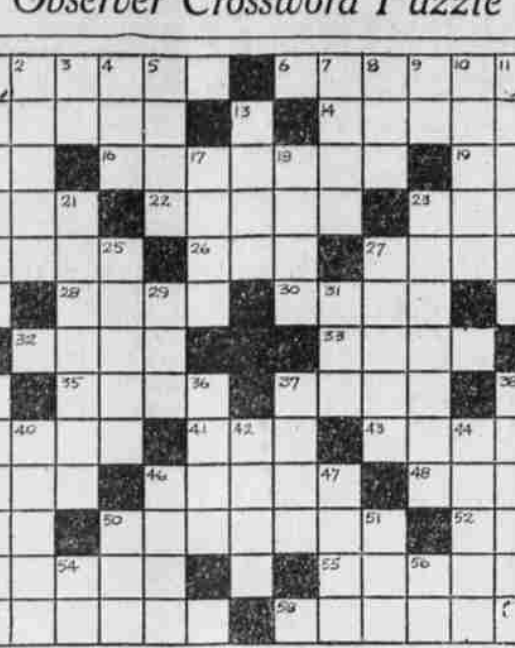

PENDLETON, Ore.—A new record for volume of material moved during one month on the government dam being constructed across McKay creek, seven miles south of Pendleton, was established during April when 153,000 cubic yards of gravel were placed on the road and packed in place, according to measurements made by the government engineers in charge. The previous high mark was 100,000 cubic yards, which was made during March.
