### "Sackcloth and Scarlet" Is Appealing Story.

"Sackcloth and Scarlet," Henry King's first American-made picture in two years—an unusually human and appealing story of two sisters, adapted from the novel by George Gibbs, comes to the Arcade theater on Friday for a run of two days. Alice Terry is featured in the cast which includes, among other big names, Dorothy Sebastian, Orville Caldwell, Otto Matzsch, Kathleen Kirkham and John Miljan.

Three locations, the far west, New York and France, play prominent roles in the unfolding of this Paramount picture.

The story starts in a fashionable mountain resort in California with Polly Freeman, Dorothy Sebastian, a wealthy, witty, spoiled 19-year-old New York girl, carrying on a dangerous flirtation with Stephen Edwards, played by Orville Caldwell, one of the guides, a handsome, manly young fellow, but unaware that the girl is only playing at love. Polly is happy until Edwards asks her to marry him, when she takes French leave and returns to New York, where she and her sister Joan (Miss Terry) maintain a beautiful home. They are orphans.

The director is claimed to have painted a beautiful and convincing picture of sacrifice—with Alice Terry giving all, even her good name, and Dorothy Sebastian taking all.

Polly runs away to Paris and marries a dancer. Joan is outraged and held guilty for the sin committed by Polly. Finally Joan goes to Washington, where she meets and falls in love with Edwards who has worked hard, succeeded and been sent to congress.

### He proposes and breaks down Joan's scruples regarding what she says is a barrier by saying his past life, too, is under a shadow and that their love is strong enough to overcome any past mistakes.

A few days before the wedding, Polly, who has discovered her husband, disappears. Jealous of her sister, despite the sacrifice, the latter has made for her, she determines to claim the now successful Edwards.

The many big dramatic situations in the earlier portions of the story reach a tense and unusual climax.

**Dramatic Story Woven Around Popular Adage.**

"Two Shall Be Born" is the title of the attraction at Shorty's theater tonight. It is a Whitman Bennett production adapted from the novel of the same name by Marie Conway Oelber. The cast was selected with care and contains the names of several screen and stage stars. The story, owing to several peculiar twists, requires an exceptionally large cast, each member of which is called upon to give some intense dramatic action.
