them were pretty bad."

"We have already purchased three vessels from the shipping board," he added. "We took these three boats for pioneering and we know their limitations. Two of the boats are of about 2000 tons. The third, the East Indian, is slightly larger and is now being put into shape for service to Denmark, which we hope will begin about August 1."

Mr. Ford indirectly refused a statement which O'Connor is alleged to have made to newspaper men in Buffalo, that Ford would become the greatest ship owner in the world's history by making the remark that he did not intend to use more than a few of the ships, scrapping the remainder.

Mr. Ford estimated the cost of constructing apparatus to dismantle the ships would amount to about four hundred thousand dollars.

A price of 8 1/2 cents a pound is to be paid for all chinook salmon from May 15 to August 14 inclusive; 6 1/2 cents from August 15 to

September 1 and four cents from September 1 to October 1. Seventy-five fishermen attended the meeting.

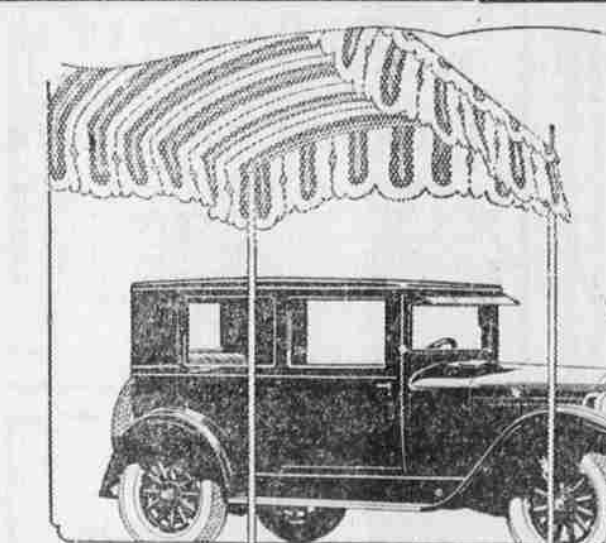
