where not opened or practicable to use, then said poles, anchors or conduits may be erected and laid in the streets and other thoroughfares of the city.

Section 2. Each wire, cable or conductor may be strung on poles or other fixtures above the ground or laid under the ground in pipes or conduits or such other apparatus as may be necessary or proper to operate such telephone system, but in accordance with the laws of this state and the requirements and regulations of the Public Service Commission of Oregon, except that where crossing over streets, the space between the surface of the earth and the lowest wire, cable or supporting strand shall be not less than twenty-seven feet.

Section 3. It shall be lawful, and the right is hereby granted to said company, its successors and assigns, to make all needful excavations for the purpose of erecting, laying, operating and maintaining poles, anchors or other supports for said wires and for the purpose of laying down, maintaining and operating its conduits, cables and wires under ground. It shall be lawful, and the right is hereby granted to said company, its successors and assigns, to remove, under the direction of the city manager or street committee, any element of a disturbing or detrimental character which interferes with any of the property of said company which has been or is hereafter erected in accordance with the conditions named herein.

Section 4. Whenever the said corporation, its successors or assigns, shall disturb any of said alleys or streets or water pipes or sewers therein, for the purposes aforesaid, it or they shall restore the same to as good condition as found when excavations were commenced, and without unnecessary delay; and upon failure the city shall have the right to fix a reasonable time, not to exceed thirty days nor less than twenty-four hours, during which such repairs to and restoration of said alleys or streets or water pipes or sewers

therein, as aforesaid, shall be completed, and in case of failure of said corporation to make said repairs within the time set by the city or the Commission thereof, the city shall cause said repairs to be made at the expense of said corporation, the grantee of this franchise, and the said expense shall be a lien upon the property, apparatus, poles, wires and other appliances of said company, and shall be entered in the city lien docket, and be enforced in the same manner as city liens for grading or otherwise improving of streets.

Section 5. The places where said poles and anchors are to be set or maintained shall be such as to do as little damage to, or obstruction of said alleys or streets as is consistent with the effective construction and maintaining of said line.

Section 6. Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed in any way to prevent the proper authorities of the city from sewer, grading, planning, repairing or altering any of the streets or alleys of the city for all such work shall be done, if practicable, so as not to obstruct or injure the free use of said poles or wires, anchors, conductors, conduits, pipes or other apparatus.

Section 7. The rights, privileges and franchises hereby granted to said Home Independent Telephone Company, its successors and assigns, shall continue and be in full force and effect for the full period of twenty years from and after September 10, 1927, and all rights, privileges and franchises granted to said company under and by virtue of Ordinance No. 354, Series 1927, and the obligations thereof, are hereby renewed, and shall utterly cease, determine and end on said 10th day of September, 1927, and thereafter said ordinance shall be of the same effect as if the same had never been passed, except that the same shall be deemed to be in existence for the benefit of both parties thereto as to any and all rights accrued thereunder prior to

September 10, 1927.

Section 8. In consideration of the privileges and franchises granted by this Ordinance, the said Home Independent Telephone Company, a corporation, agrees to defend all actions, and, if damages be awarded, to pay all damages resulting from injuries sustained by reason of any excavation, poles or other appliances used by it or under its control, except in any such constructed by the city of La Grande.

Section 9. In further consideration of the rights hereby granted, the said Home Independent Telephone Company, its successors or assigns, shall have the right to suspend on the poles upon any of the streets or alleys, any or all such wires which it may require for fire alarm or police purposes, where the same does not interfere with the operation of the company, and at places to be mutually agreed upon.

Section 10. In further consideration of the rights hereby granted the said Home Independent Telephone Company, its successors or assigns, the said Home Independent Telephone Company hereby agrees to make to said city the direct payment of the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars, and in addition to pay for all publications of this ordinance as proposed, and notices in connection with the introduction and passage of this ordinance.

Section 11. In further consideration of the rights hereby granted the said Home Independent Telephone Company, its successors or assigns, the said Home Independent Telephone Company hereby agrees to pay to the said city of La Grande, during the life of this franchise, four per centum (4%) of the gross earnings of the company derived from the rentals or telephone which are or may be operated by it within the said city of La Grande, same to be paid in monthly installments.

Said corporation agrees to furnish the city, at the end of each month, a verified statement of its gross earnings covering such business, and to allow the inspection of its books at all reasonable hours upon demand of the Commission.

Section 12. Every charge, rate, fee or compensation made or demanded by the grantee of this franchise for any service rendered or to be rendered shall be just, fair and reasonable. The Public Service Commission of Oregon shall have the power to determine what charges, rates, fees and compensations made, charged or demanded by said corporation, are unjust, unreasonable, insufficient or unjustly discriminatory or preferential, and to fix those which are just, reasonable and sufficient.

Section 13. This franchise, and all rights granted hereunder, shall be subject to the provisions of Sections 1 to 16 of Chapter VI of the Charter of the City of La Grande, Union County, Oregon, as adopted by the voters thereof at a general election thereof on December 13, 1915, and amended November 7, 1922, except so far as the same may be modified or superseded by the Constitution and laws of the State of Oregon and of the United States.

Section 14. This ordinance shall be inoperative unless the payment mentioned in Section 10 shall be made, and unless this ordinance is accepted in writing, all to be filed with the Recorder of the city of La Grande within forty days after the passage of this ordinance. Passed and adopted by the commission of the city of La Grande, Oregon, this _____ day of 1925 by _____ commissioners voting therefor.
