Brothers Win Fame in Variety of Athletics

PIERRE, S. D. (AP)—Five brothers who have won fame in athletics give the Cooper family of Pierre claim to distinction. Kenneth Cooper, eldest of the brothers, after winning first places in rodeo exhibitions throughout the northwest for several seasons, went to the British Empire exposition at Wembley, England, with the American rodeo delegation last summer and proved himself the outstanding artist of the troupe.

ST. THOMAS, Nev. (AP)—Dr. M. R. Harrington, archaeologist in charge of research work in "The buried city of Nevada," says the theory that the place was built by ancestors of Pueblo Indians in New Mexico and Arizona is being substantiated increasingly as the work of excavation goes on.

RAINS BRING FIRE HAZARDS

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Heavy spring rains, which make two blades of grass grow where one grew before, increase rather than decrease the fire hazard to forests, although at the time of precipitation and while the grass is green, the danger is lessened, it is pointed out by Paul G. Redington, United States district forester for California.

Northern California, due to its moist spring season, is a waving field of luxuriant grass, but as the dry, warm weather comes on an alert eye must be maintained unless last year's disastrous fire record is to be equaled, he said.

Last year the government spent \$391,000 in California for fire prevention and protection. There were 2,927 fires, of which 81 per cent were man made.

This year, profiting by a study of the lessons of last year, the forest service will use the airplane more extensively, utilizing a federal appropriation of \$50,000 for this purpose.
