### Arbitrators to Decide Pay of German Actors

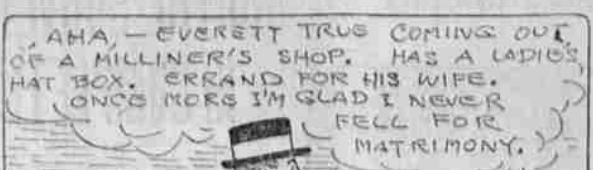
BERLIN (AP)—The long conflict between the theater producers of Germany and the stars, or prominent actors, as they call themselves, has at last been ended. The stars have scored what will probably prove an empty victory. The clause in the managers' agreement to which they particularly objected was that by which they were placed in four half-and-half classes, with definite maximum fees for each class. They declared this was incompatible with their dignity as artists, and that no artist could submit to having such a strait-jacket put on him.

The classification has been abandoned. Every actor is free to make his arrangements from play to play. But whenever an actor wants to emerge beyond the ordinary class whose maximum fee is fixed at \$75 a night, an arbitration board of three men must deliver an opinion as to whether his claim for a higher wage is justified. The feeling in German theater circles is that the stars have saved their pride at the expense of their pocketbooks.
