American Evaporated Milk Finds New Foreign Markets

CHICAGO (AP)—Sales of evaporated milk in the United States reached a total value of \$17,272,555 in 1924, according to the annual report of the industry issued here by Herbert C. Hoels, secretary of the Evaporated Milk association.

Export sales last year totaled 2,969,236 cases, a gain of 187,447 cases over 1923. While European countries were the principal buyers, an extensive market for the product is being built up in Central and South America, said the report.

GOITRE SURVEY IS COMPLETED

Dr. W. P. McAdory completed the examination of the children of the grade schools of La Grande for enlarged thyroid glands and diseased tonsils yesterday. He reports that there is not much evidence of goitre to be found among the grade school children and much less than he expected to find in this locality, as this condition seems to exist more in the northwest section of the United States than in any other.

A larger percentage of children have diseased tonsils, however, and several have had their tonsils removed. The exact percentage of children with bad tonsils is not obtainable at the present time, but is quite large.

The inspection of the schools by Dr. McAdory was carried on under the auspices of the Oregon State Board of Health. He wishes to thank the teachers for their cooperation with him in carrying out his instructions by this organization.

answer of St. Paul, of the New Testament, is that God was in Christ. The history of the Christian church can display no sadder spectacle than the present day tendency to explain our Lord Jesus Christ in the terms of exalted humanity only. With what Paul called "good words and fair speeches" men who have never really bowed before the Son of God as Redeemer have deceived the hearts of the simple and induced them to follow a literary and rhetorical Jesus who never existed and who is unable to deliver from sin and death.

"The chief trouble with our churches today is that nobody is a sinner any more. From our pulpits we hear much of the dignity of man, and a great deal about vision, courage, service, community obligation, and how to abolish war, but almost nothing of sin, old fashioned, scriptural, unadorned, uninvolved, unadorned, God-defying, death-deserving, soul-destroying sin. Yet to deal with that kind of sin Christ came into the world.

"The present day confusion in religious thinking and teaching is due to the fact that Christianity is a divine remedy for sin and a salvation for sinners, and men are making the hopeless and impossible effort to fit such a religion to men who are not sinners.

"The great controversy which has shaken all our churches has revealed and indifference to truth and humiliating denial of Christ in his own temples and courts. But that is not all. It has also revealed the fact that there now exists between true believers a bond of unity and brotherhood. This is a unity, not a plaster and ramshackle federations and resolutions, but a unity of faith in Jesus as the alone Redeemer from sin.

"The grand and encouraging thing is that in every communion there were disciples of Christ, rich and poor, young and old, educated and uneducated, theologians and simple believers, who instinctively recognized that an enemy of Christ and of faith was in their midst, and who, by the quick and inflexible glance of faith, saw the grim face of anti-Christ beneath the mask of apparent friendliness to Christ and His Church. Nothing in the history of the Christian church should so hearten and fortify the hearts of Christ's disciples than the way in which, in our own day and generation, men out of all churches and communions, clasping the hands of brotherhood and faith, arose out with one voice against anti-Christian teaching and preaching and shake the earth with their testimony to Jesus Christ as the Eternal Son of God and the sinner's Saviour, Christ Jesus, our Lord. To win men to the love of God, to introduce men to the citizenship of heaven, to plant their wandering feet upon the Rock of Ages, that is the high and holy task of Christ's church upon earth."

New Survey Crew Out.

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore.—A fourth survey crew of the Oregon Trunk line started work from Bend southwestward toward Oribel, O. V. Latture, assistant general manager of the Oregon Trunk line announced. This makes four full line survey crews, located as follows: One in Wacusa valley to the east of the city, a second in the Bonanza country and a third at the end of the Southern Pacific rails north of Kirk.

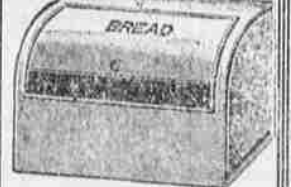
