COLLEGES FAIL TO LEAD GIRLS FROM MARRIAGE

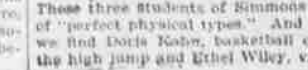
LOS ANGELES, (AP) — Authorities at the University of Southern California, making public the results of a questionnaire of 922 women graduates of the institution during the period of 1920-24, declare that a university education does not lead women away from marriage.

The tabulation showed that more than a third of the feminine graduates who replied were married, either while attending the university, or within four years after their graduation.

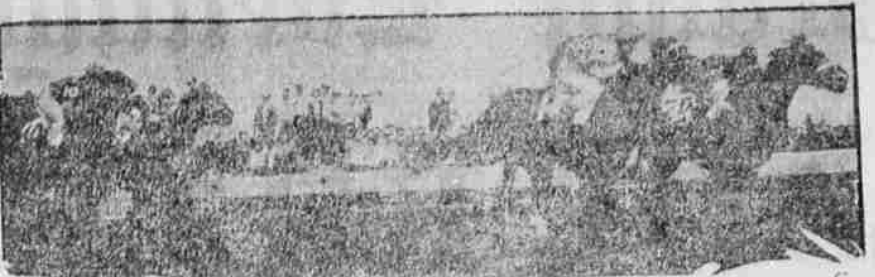
A total of 418 answered the queries. Of this number, 242 chose the profession of wife, homemaker and housekeeper.

Nine engaged in commercial pursuits, including banking. Fifty-two took up fine arts, including music, dancing and painting. Twelve turned to the law, three to medicine and three entered the ministry. Other occupations—such as nursing, agriculture, journalism, public service and social service—claim 24, and 123 became teachers.
