Hoot Gibson becomes a riding policeman who frustrates the schemes of a band of outlaws in "The Saddle Hawk," a Universal production to be shown in the Star Theatre, commencing Wednesday.

Other later varieties promise big yields, according to farmers. Federation is needed on 75,000 acres, and one more good rain by the middle of June will insure a crop from this acreage.
