## Pony Express Rider Is Hero of Pathe Serial.

When one thinks of the period of the Civil war, one is very liable to think only of the brave men in blue and gray who fought and died for the cause which they thought was right. They see the memory of their deeds on the battle fields is brought to mind. And justly so.

But at that same period in the history of this country, there were other heroes whose names were never listed on any honor roll, but whose daring exploits are none the less worthy of remembrance. They were the Pony Express riders, who carried the mail through the vast expanse of wilderness that lay west of the Mississippi. It was their duty to carry messages from one isolated community to another. It also consisted of purchasing and disposing of various products and receiving orders of gold from the mines to government headquarters. Through all kinds of weather, at all brave men forced their way across the country, in the face of hostile Indians and desperadoes that infested the plains at that time. Unheralded and unsung, they "carried on" and, although their names have been lost to posterity, the riders of the Pony Express will always stand
