

Economists Studying Plans To Facilitate Purchase of Farms

BOZEMAN, Mont. (AP) — An agricultural experiment of nationwide interest, whereby well known economists, agriculturalists and really men hope to find the most practical solution of the landlord-tenant problem on the farm, is under way in the northwest this spring.

Backed by funds loaned through the Laura Spellman Rockefeller foundation, and under the guidance of economists, successful farmers and realty men, the Fairway Farms corporation has secured farms and engaged tenants in the northwest to start operation of an experiment in the interest of agricultural science.

The announcement of the new corporation and its backing by the Laura Spellman Rockefeller foundation has been made in Montana by M. L. Wilson and J. L. Humphrey, directors of the corporation. The corporation, they explain, seeks to establish four fundamental farms in the northwestern Great Plains region. Through these experiments they will seek to demonstrate as follows:

First, that sound landlord-tenant relations can be established whereby the capable tenant with limited capital may, within a reasonable time, become a farm owner if he is given proper guidance and working capital by an intelligent landlord.

Second, that workable plans can be developed for the settlement and development of privately owned lands under competent guidance and direction, with reasonable interest on invested capital.

Third, that there can be developed a type of agriculture best suited to the northern Great Plains area.

Fourth, that there is a field for private capital in the formation of farm companies which will purchase or contract for purchase of farms; reorganize, lease under corporation and resell them to capable young tenants who have demonstrated character and industry, but who lack capital to buy land.

The Fairway Farms corporation will select competent agricultural experts to advise with the tenants, so that each tenant will have the advice of a trained specialist who is in turn, backed by the experience and judgment of economists, successful farmers and realty men. Because a number of these farms will be in Montana, a working agreement has been made with the Montana State College extension service to use them as a basis for
