### English Expert Forecasts

Radio Control of Raiders  
MANCHESTER, Eng. (AP)—Dr. L. S. Palmer, chief of the applied physics department of the College of Technology, Manchester, told the Manchester Missionary and Philosophical Society recently that in the next war that which was accomplished by the British in the Zeppelin raid in 1915, could all be done by wireless.

A soldier in a dugout in England could send out a fleet of boats and Dr. Palmer, guide the vessels by radio to a certain point, make the discharge bombs and then bring them back without airplane observation. The course of the ships would have to be plotted upon a map but with airplane observation a raid could be made against the enemy with great precision. The speaker explained that in controlling a torpedo aimed, for example, at a submarine, the torpedo could be seen all the time, and if it went the wrong way a tip of a key would alter its course and send it in the direction of the target.

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Five hundred oil paintings and etchings by leading contemporary artists of North, Central and South America will be brought together here for a three-month display when the Pan-American exhibition opens November 3, this year, at the Los Angeles museum. The exhibition, in which paintings by artists from Canada and the United States of North America, Mexico and Panama of Central America, and Brazil, Argentina, Peru and Chile of South America, will be exhibited, will mark the first representation in this country since 1915 of the southern continent's art. Argentina, in 1915, entered a remarkable exhibit in the Panama Pacific International exposition at San Francisco.

### Americans Played Ball A Thousand Years Ago

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. (AP)—Playing ball was America's national sport before Eric the Red discovered Greenland, and the baseball leagues of today are not very different from the circuits that drew big crowds to its games when Daniel Boone was cutting his first teeth on a bear-claw necklace.

Additional proof of this is found in the autobiography of Black Hawk, but of the great Indian war chief who fought in Illinois. He told of the great ball games that used to be played among the tribes in the Mississippi valley, and related that from 500 to 1000 persons often played on one side.

Another feature, the autobiography relates, was the gaubling which took place among the tribes, and individual Indians on the outcome of the game. The red man often risked all his worldly possessions, in a wager on the home team.
