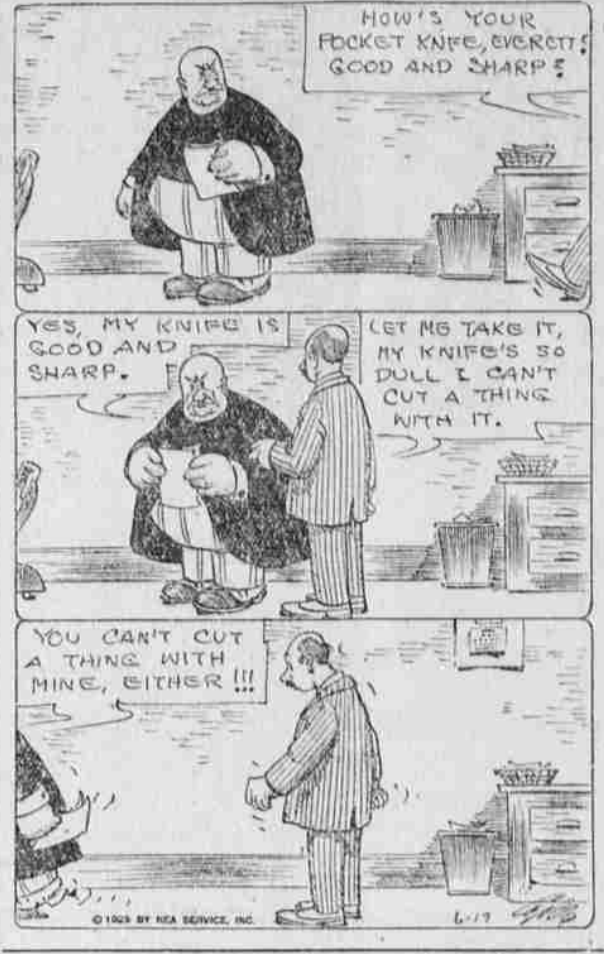

MEDICAL EXAMS RECOMMENDED

MINNEAPOLIS (By the Associated Press)—"More could be accomplished in developing health, forestalling disease and providing for success in treatment of all the preventable and many of the non-preventable diseases if all persons at all ages were examined at intervals according to their age and condition, than by any other resource or device applicable to conditions in this country at present."

This statement, made by Dr. Haven Emerson, New York City, before the National Tuberculosis association, was the basis of a plan and plan for periodic health examinations for men, women and children of all ages being launched jointly by the American Medical association, the National Tuberculosis association and other health agencies.

Dr. Emerson's plan for periodic health examinations for all ages included the following:

For the expectant mother, at least four medical observations between the fourth and eighth month of pregnancy, of which perhaps only one need be by a physician if reports can be obtained during the intervals by a visiting nurse. At least 12 hospital observations in the first two years of life, of which six in the first six months.

Six in the years 2-5 (one each 4 months), unless acute febrile infection or serious loss of weight demands more frequent examination.

Once a year from 6-25 (unless acute febrile disease or loss of weight calls for additional examinations during the year).

Once every two years 25-45 unless there is a definite disturbance of weight either excess or loss, or albumin or sugar in the urine.

Once a year 45-65 unless overweight, high blood pressure, albumin or sugar in urine is present, in which case the examinations should be once every six months.

At 65 an examination every six months.
