Tunnel About Finished.
 BEND, Ore.—Under construction for 17 months, since January, 1924, the Eugene-Klamath Falls railway tunnel, piercing the Cascades of the northwest end of Odeh lake, will be completed this week when crews working from both sides of the mountain will meet under the divide.
 The tunnel, the longest of 19 on the Oatridge-Kirk line, will be 2,450 feet in length, and will be the first ever bored through the Cascades from western to eastern Oregon. The tunnel, lined for the entire distance with timber, curves under the mountain.
 When the crews meet under the divide a "tunnel" celebration will be held at Odeh lake.
