BASEBALL DOPE STILL HAYWIRE

NEW YORK (AP)—Gathering new force, the two-winged tornado which swept through both major leagues two weeks ago struck the baseball peaks again last week and tossed lofty tenants of the circuits hither and yon.

The aggressive Pirate crew, one set of the storm, caught the leading Giants and Brooklyn with such force that what looked like a National league parade before the western invasion, Sunday had developed into a four cornered fight for the championship.

Shifting its course in the American, the other wing of the hurricane, directed its destructive path toward the west. From a desperate position which had left them only a half game margin over the Senators, the Macklin machine was hurled forward with the tenacious Harris team clinging to their flying coat tails.

Slugging Saves Athletics. The American league disturbance was a hitting hurricane. Terrible slugging put the Athletics temporarily out of danger with six straight victories.

The Senators, hanging on the fringe of the tornado, were carried along to five victories on superb pitching from Johnson, Zachary and Coveleskie. Their hitting was the lightest of the week in the American, but the blows were timely and "Goose" Goslin featured with three homers in one day against Cleveland, tying the modern major league record.

The Tigers rose again to sixth place, while Cleveland, jolted hard at Washington, resigned fourth place to the St. Louis Browns.

A lead of four and one-half games for the Giants dwindled to a game and a half under the punishing attack of the Pirates during the week.

With five victories in six starts to their credit, the Pirates were forced to share top honors for the week with the St. Louis Cardinals, who duplicated the performance as the result of continued good pitching and timely hitting.

Vast Sums in Prizes Increase Prices for All Yearling Colts

NEW YORK (AP)—Ever since Flying Ebony, winner of the \$20,000 Kentucky Derby, brought \$21,000 as a yearling at Saratoga, yearling colts have been netting higher average prices than ever known.

The present record breaking sale of stakes and purses for which young horsebreeders are eligible has caused the most successful followers of the thoroughbred.

Last year American, Canadian and Mexican border tracks hung up \$10,523,446 for equine competition down the homestretch, the largest winnings ever offered in modern records of the sport.

Average Prices. The average price per head of the 630 yearlings which changed hands at auctions during the year, accordingly mounted to \$2,230.22.

which was within 500 of the record set in 1921.

In 1924, the last good year in racing before the depression checked by hostile legislation, purses amounted to \$1,252,091. Purse did not approach that mark again until more than ten years later, when racing began to come back to US.

Meanwhile the yearling market operated in sympathy. The average price for 745 colts sold in 1924 was \$114 and \$112 for 861 sold in 1925. The slump of the next decade included a new low of \$230 for 256 yearlings sold in 1931, and depressed the yearly average to little better than half the figure quoted before.

First Strengthening. The market began to strengthen in 1917, first because of an influx of French bred colts, many of which were shipped over by Clarence Mackay, Mrs. H. R. Durjoy and other Americans.

The average that year advanced to \$180 for 643 colts sold. Prices rose to \$244 and \$112 for 861 sold in 1925. The slump of the next decade included a new low of \$230 for 256 yearlings sold in 1931, and depressed the yearly average to little better than half the figure quoted before.

Every since 1915 purses and yearling prices averages have moved practically in parallel. Figures of the last four seasons show:

More than 75 per cent of all yearlings sold in this country since 1917 have been auctioned at Saratoga during the summer racing meeting there. Sale books show that the average prices for Saratoga itself are higher than for the year and market as a whole.
