**687,000 Head of Game On America's National Forests**

Over 687,000 head of big game animals make their home on Uncle Sam's 159 national forests. This is the estimate for 1924, made by the forest rangers of the U. S. forest service. Of course, there may be 687,051—the rangers didn't count them, but those men are out in the hills and they estimate to a little better than anyone else's.

Compared with the previous year the 1924 figures show an increase of about 44,000 head, after the allowance is made for 44,228 head of bear which were not included in the estimates of former years but which are included in the 1924 estimates.

Forest service officials explain that this increase may be caused by the fact that 1924 was a very dry year in the west and that the drought conditions resulted in an unusual concentration of game animals around watering places which enabled the forest rangers to make closer estimates than any of former years. Only animals using national forest ranges, or practically the entire year are included in the estimates and that no account was taken of animals which graze mostly on adjacent federal lands or on privately-owned areas.

**Oregon Figures.**

Figures for the National forests alone of Oregon are 6909 bear, 69,000 deer (all kinds), 2000 elk, 30 mountain sheep and 30 antelope. For national forest areas in the state of Washington the estimates show 6800 bear, 20,000 deer, 8000 elk, 25 mountain sheep and 2000 mountain goat.

**Number of Deer Increasing**

Deer represent the vast bulk of the big game animals with a total for 1924 of 559,267 compared with 511,224 last year. An analysis of the figures shows that except in a few national forests located in California deer show a uniform increase. These few exceptions, say forestry officials, may be the results of closer estimates rather than any real decrease in number.

The five states credited with the largest number of deer, are, in the order of rank, California, Oregon, Montana, Idaho and Arizona. Alaska, also, is credited with about the same number—26,000 head—as the two last named states. More than half of the deer listed on the national forests in Arizona are on the Kaibab forest. Efforts are still being made to reduce this Kaibab herd since the amount of forage available is insufficient to support it.

**Bears Included in Estimates.**

In the 1924 estimates bears were included as game rather than as predatory animals. The figures showing 44,228 head on the 129 national forests. Of this total 28,782 were of the black and brown varieties, the balance of 15,446 being grizzlies. Nearly all grizzlies which were found on the 129 national forests in Alaska (about Montana is the only state in which the forest rangers were able to find more than a scattering few of this time-honored bear).

Elk have increased in all western forests. 21,823 head being listed for 1924 compared with 19,549 in 1923. On the Tejon national forest bordering the Yellowstone National park the elk herd has shown a notable increase because of three excellent seasons with mild winters and satisfactory summers. Forest service officials are again facing the question of keeping this herd down to a number that can be supported by the available forage.

**Antelope Herds Scarce.**

Antelope, or pronghorns, are still in a very satisfactory condition. The 1924 count shows only 3073 of these animals, most of which are to be found in the national forests of Arizona and Idaho. In northwestern Nevada and southeastern Oregon there is a herd grazing on public lands outside the national forest areas.

The number of moose found in 1924 shows a loss compared with 1923, only 1388 head of these magnificent animals being shown last year compared with 1500 in 1923. However, it is explained that the decrease is caused by more accurate estimates. The number of moose on national forests is given as 12,822 and 12,244 respectively, a slight increase over 1923. Herds were dropped out of the 1924 estimates as these animals are now only to be found in protected herds.

In discussing the 1924 estimates of big game animals, officials of the forest service make it plain that these are estimates and that they are considered as accurate as such figures can be made where an actual count is not possible.

**Wild Beasts of Greenland Come South for Summer**

OSLO, Norway (AP)—Ten musk oxen, brought from Greenland recently on a sailing vessel, are spending the summer on Kijholmen island, off the west coast of Norway. It is hoped they will become used to the climate of northern Europe. The flesh of these animals makes excellent eating, as Arctic explorers can testify, and there is always a demand for them in zoological gardens.

The animals wander at will about the island, finding an abundance of food in the grasses and rough herbage. They still resent the approach of human beings, however, and when danger or disturbance is caused the bulls form a protective ring about the cows and snort violently.

The most anxious time for those interested in the experiment will be during the summer. The natural habitat of the musk ox is among the bleak regions of arctic America and it is possible that they will survive a more southern summer. There is also danger that they will die through their own greediness of the wet or grass of Kijholmen.

Even stags, free from mold and made from fairly mature cows, is unexcelled in Oregon as a cheap winter ration for horses, says the experiment station.
