Salmon Rack Removal Is Promised

State Game Commissioners Made Decision at Union Meeting This Morning.

The salmon racks at Union are to be removed at once. That decision was reached by R. E. Clanton, state superintendent of hatcheries, this morning after a personal investigation of the conditions at the Union hatchery.

Mr. Clanton found that the claims of the sportsmen were justified and a recommendation by Mr. Bonney, superintendent of the Union hatchery to have the racks taken out was also one of the factors in the final decision.

The racks will be taken down immediately and the entire stream with the exception of private property will be open to salmon fishing with gills under the usual regulations until July first.

Mr. Clanton, accompanied by Harold Clifford, chairman of the game commission, John Waldoo, county game warden, Irvin French, superintendent of the Wallowa hatchery and a group of sportsmen from La Grande made their trip to Union this morning to get the matter of the racks amicably settled.

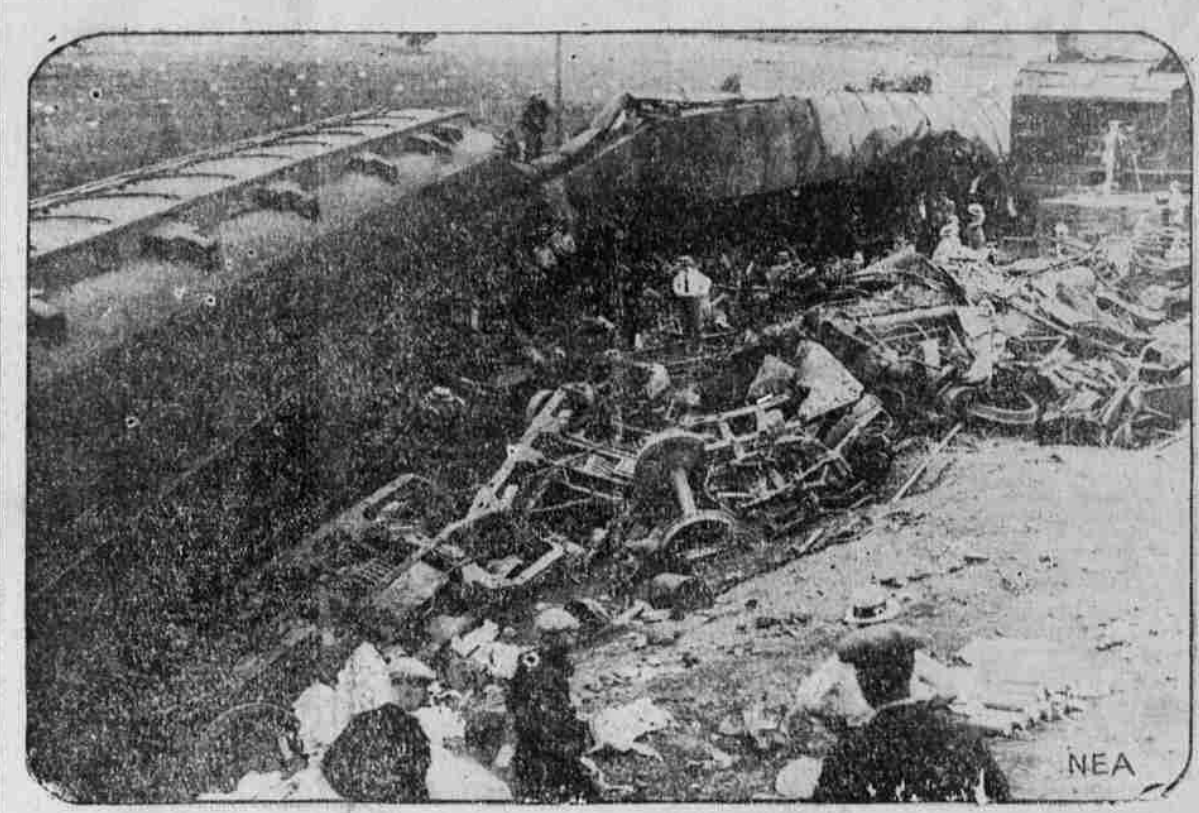
