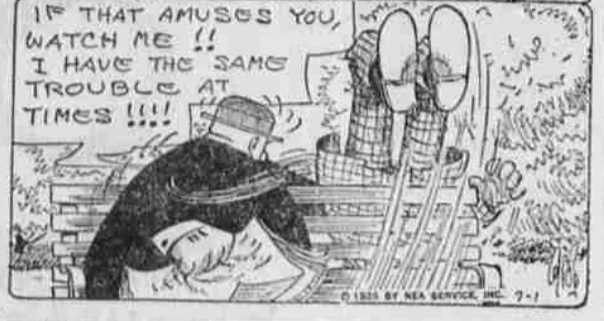

Brazil Is Concerned Over Coffee-Handling Profits
RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil (AP) — What causes the high price of coffee? Brazil believes that the Americans are gaining huge profits and have resolved to find out the truth. The president of the state of Sao Paulo, in an interview, has stated that three or four men are now in the United States trying to ascertain the amount of profits made by the American roasters. He added that coffee men in Sao Paulo are convinced that a marketing group, somewhere between the Brazilian exporter and the American consumer, is securing profits that are large enough to injure the trade.

Two newspapers in Rio de Janeiro have recently pointed out that the profits of Brazilian coffee growers are very high, and have advised caution in continuing a policy which might lead to serious financial trouble for the country.

One of these papers, O Jornal, says that "the hostile attitude of the North American is the result of prices which even Brazilians admit are extortionate."
"Coffee growers should be satisfied with less profits," is the opinion of O Brasil, which adds that "financial returns should be confined to a reasonable amount. Coffee, at present prices, guarantees a big income. Plantation owners, according to their published income reports, have net profits ranging from 25 to 100 per cent on the money invested. The American non-buying movement to force down the price is perfectly legitimate."
Producers usually deny the assertion that they are gaining 100 per cent annually on the money invested. It is pointed out that farm values are rising rapidly. Dr. Augusto Ramos, author of a book on coffee and a former manager of a large plantation, says that the average plan coffee farm in the Sao Paulo region is now giving an annual profit of \$2,000, and that the market value of the farm would be about \$150,000. He claims that the growers are only securing a reasonable profit and that they cannot sell at a price below present quotations.

There are numerous indications that Brazil expects to hold its price of coffee. The new competitive defense committee of Sao Paulo has been buying on the Santos market to prevent a fall in prices. A movement has just been started by the state of Sao Paulo to secure coordinated action among the neighboring coffee growing states for holding back supplies of coffee for the port of Rio de Janeiro, similar to the system used in Santos.

The June number of Mexican Business, the official magazine of the American Chamber of Commerce for Mexico, publishes the following statement, in an unqualified article, on the coffee situation:
"We believe that moderate amounts will govern the future policy of Brazil in regard to her great staple industry, for she would risk too much by a prolonged attempt to circumvent the fundamental law of supply and demand. The continued presence
