\$500,000 Value Lumber Exported to June 26th

PORTLAND, Ore. (Special)—According to statistics compiled by the Traffic Department of the Port of Portland, exports of lumber for the first 26 days of June amounted to 25,412,083 feet or nearly 1,000,000 feet per day. The value of this lumber exported is \$537,451. This was carried by twenty vessels of which seven were destined to the Orient, five to Europe, two to the West Coast of South America, one to the East Coast of South America and five to Australia and New Zealand. Besides this large cargo were shipped great quantities down the river.

Shipments of lumber to the Orient during this month have been heavy.

Portland following the purchase of a new pump for the fire department, will be making a new fire truck, authorized at the June third municipal election.

The present plan is to rearrange the city hall interior so as to permit more room for the fire department, still leaving adequate room for the recorder and treasurer offices and the police department.

HEAT AIDS ROYAL ANNES

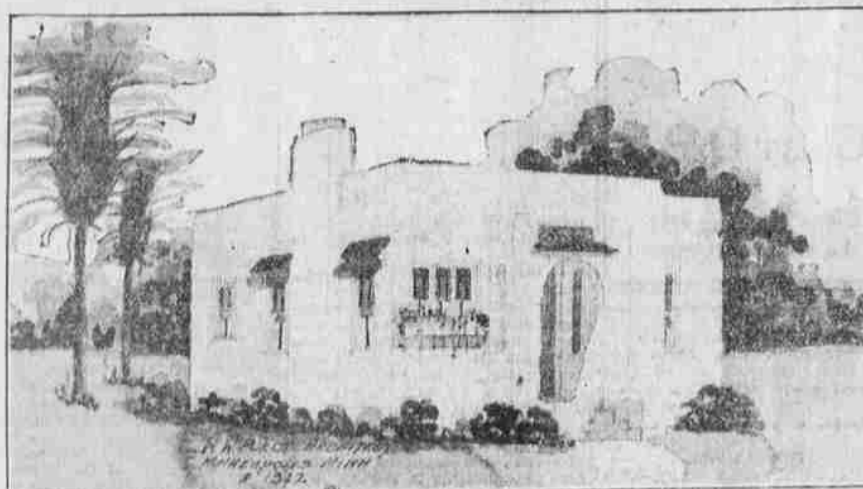

A Southern Bungalow



(By W. W. Parry)

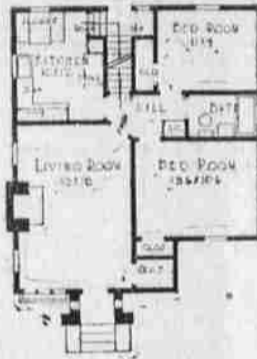
The little home here pictured is that of a small one-story bungalow with two bedrooms.

The living room is large enough to permit a small golfing table in the rear for dining purposes on special occasions, while in the kitchen a built-in alcove to serve as a breakfast room has been provided.

A stairway leads to a well-ventilated attic over the basement stairs.

The basement is complete with the usual heating plant, laundry and storage space. Finished in hardwood, with hardwood trim, pine to paint in the bedrooms, this home should be built for about \$4500 exclusive of heating and plumbing.

The exterior walls are of smooth cement plaster over metal lath, with asphalt shingles on the roof.



Permits

Ile of Pines Has Record Fruit and Vegetable Crop HAVANA (AP)—Information received here indicates that conditions on the Isle of Pines are improving, the largest fruit and vegetable crop ever grown there having been marketed this season.

Ratification of the Hay-Quesada treaty, confirming Cuba's claim to the island, has been accepted by Cuban and American residents as beneficial to both. It was said. Diversity of crops has been a boon to all and plans are being made to plant a greater variety of food-stuffs.

Mussolini Government Buys Valuable Historic Document

ROME (AP)—One of the most interesting historical documents of Italy's struggle to free herself from foreign rulers, has been snatched out of the hands of private collectors and purchased on behalf of the Roman Museum of the "Risorgimento" through the personal intercession of Premier Mussolini.

The document is the protest made July 4, 1849, by the Roman Constituent Assembly before Italy before France and before the whole world against the violent invasion of its headquarters on the Capitol hill. It bears the autographed signatures of nearly all the members of the Assembly from Garibaldi to Mazzini.

Signor Mussolini, hearing that the document was being offered for sale at a large price, ordered that it be purchased immediately.

Coyotes Reveal Cooperation in Striking Elusive Pheasant

WALLA WALLA, Wash. (AP)—That coyotes understand the rudiments of cooperation is indicated by a story told by Thomas Snore, a farmer on Mill creek, near here.

A coyote attracted his attention as he was plowing, Snore said. It paced to and fro like a sentry on guard duty. A Chinese pheasant rooster a short distance beyond was being forced slowly away from the animal, since with each round turn, the rooster came a little closer to the fowl's position. Then beyond the bird, a second coyote was disclosed, crouched, waiting. Presently the waiting coyote became impatient, and leaped at the pheasant, missing it.

The bird flew away, and the two coyotes departed together.

American College Professor Honored by Rumanian King

LONDON (AP)—The King of Rumania has conferred the Order of the "Crown of Rumania" in the degree of commander, upon Professor Frank E. Peterson, of Luther College, Iowa, who is on leave of absence from his college as Research Fellow of the University of Michigan in classics. For two years Professor Peterson has been on the staff of the University of Michigan expedition to the Near East.

The decoration was conferred by means of a scroll rendered in connection with the Congress of Byzantine Studies, held in Bucharest in April, 1924, at which Professor Peterson represented several American universities.

Bad Mowers Make Bad Lawns in La Grande

Much of the success in establishing a level, velvety carpet of lawn depends upon the mowing. The main need is a good lawn mower. There are scores of lawn mowers on the market, but it will be economy in the long run to get a good mower. The main factor in selecting a mower is the quality of steel in the blades. Will they stand sharpening? Many of the cheap grades of mowers won't. When the first edge is worn off they never perform up to the mark again, despite constant sharpening.

The result is a ragged looking lawn after the mower runs over it, and the blower and more turbulent the growth, the worse the job. A first-class high-grade mower is rather expensive, but it is better to start with a neighbor and get a good mower than to waste money on a bargain counter machine that won't hold up over summer. Find out what sort of steel is in the blades and get the dealer's word for it before taking it away from the store.

Mowers with good steel blades which will take sharpening run twice as easily as the poorer grades and there is great saving in time, labor, and nerves. A cheap mower is poor economy.

A last sprinkling of nitrate will be a help to the grass at this stage, to keep up the spring rush. Sprinkle it sparingly, but as evenly as possible, and be sure that all corners are broken fine. A topup will bring up a heavy growth about it after dropping in a pasture.

The lawn will need no more nitrate until the dry weather hits it and it begins to thin out. Then give light dressings before setting it down with the sprinbler.

If there are a few thin spots, scatter white clover seed. It will make a quick cover and give a green surface in a short time. Grass seed may be sown all this month with certainty of a fine stand by fall.
