Great Flame Spectacle Filmed For "Quo Vadis"

One of the greatest fire spectacles ever filmed for the screen is said to be that of the burning of Rome in First National's new and magnificent version of "Quo Vadis."

The realism finds primary basis in the fact that the picture was filmed in Rome, on the actual scene of Nero's tyrannies. Below the balustrade of the Palatine, whereon stands the eternal caesars, surrounding his fire, stretches forth a vast panorama of an entire city burning.

Dore Davidson Is Inimitably Funny In "Welcome Stranger."

Holy Year Throngs Change Rome Daily

ROME (AP)—Rome cannot compare with New York, London or Paris as a cosmopolis but the 1925 Holy Year which is now bringing the city an average of 10,000 pilgrim arrivals daily has given the city a type of cosmopolitanism of which none of the three great world capitals can boast.

Where as the sidewalks of Times Square, Piccadilly Circus or the Place de l'Opera are thronged nearly every day of the year with polyglot crowds representing scores of different nations and as many tongues, the complexion of the main thoroughfares of Rome in point of foreign pedestrian changes from week to week, almost from day to day.

One day—when a large group pilgrimage from Warsaw has arrived to participate in the Holy Year ceremonies—the streets resound with the harsh accents of the Polish tongue. Then, within a few days, not a Pole is to be found and instead German swiss with their quaint peasant costumes walk the streets, peering into shop windows.

The sanctification of a new French saint at St. Peter's Basilica brings to Rome scores of thousands of French men and women and for a week nothing but French is heard. Almost overnight the French have disappeared and have been succeeded by German and Dutch.

Swartly Portuguese have their lining and are succeeded by blond Scandinavians. When the Roman

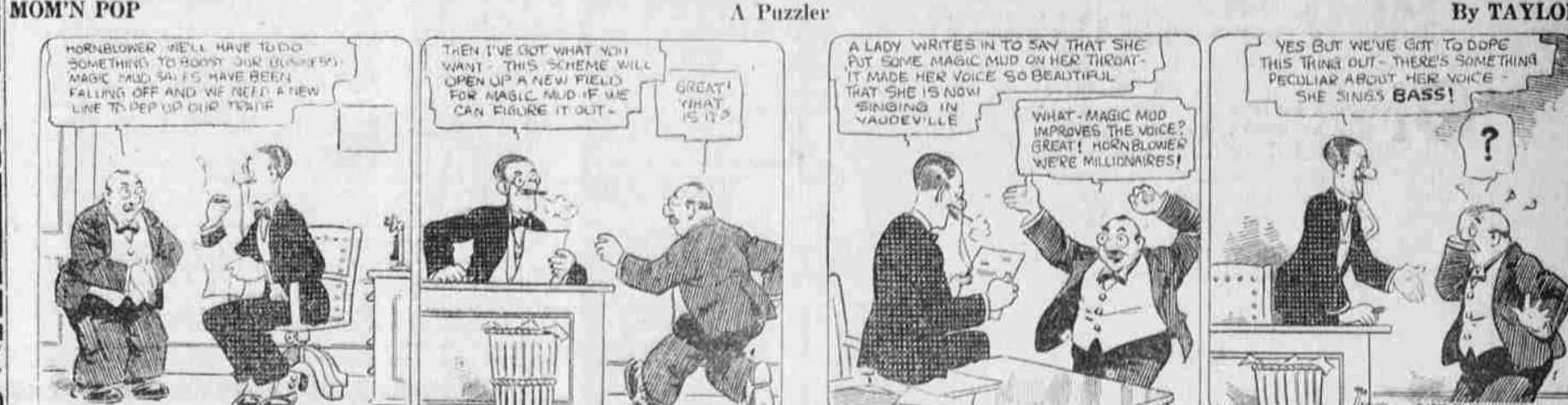
