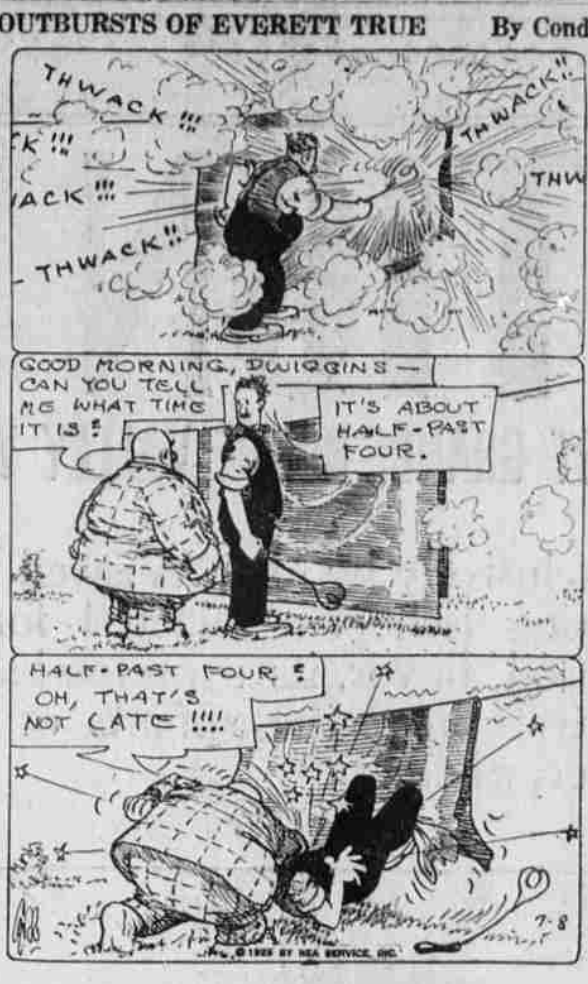

"Quo Vadis" is one of the most interesting productions that have ever been screened. It is correct historically, delightful artistically and perfect in detail and perspective, besides being a profound psychological study.

The scene is Rome in the time of Nero, most corrupt of the Caesars, when the Eternal City was the melting pot of the world. The contrast between Nero and the Apostle Peter, the Empress Poppaea Augusta and the Christian martyr, with the transformation of Vitellius' life and character through his love for Lygia are as vivid as anything in the drama or in literature. The scenes are tremendously real and spectacular.

Nothing more realistic has ever been accomplished in photographic art than the portrayal of the great Roman banquets, the burning of Rome and the scenes in the arena the tossing of the Christians to the lions, "Crucis" scenes of Lygia from the back of the raging bull, and others.

Earl Jannings, whose characterizations in "Deception" and other pictures, won him international fame, has role of Nero and carries off the honors of the production.

American screen patrons are introduced to a new leading woman in the person of Lillian Hall Dax, noted English star. As Lygia she makes her debut on the screen in this country and gives a promise of becoming a favorite here.

"Quo Vadis" will continue at the Arcade Theatre until Friday.

GERMAN TELLS OF HUMANS OF YEAR 50,000 B. C.

HEIDELBERG (AP)—The ideas of mankind 50,000 years ago, was the subject of a discourse by Professor Bern of Bonn university at the Congress of German Philologists. About 20,000 B. C. the art of the glacial period began to flourish in Europe, said the speaker. This art, he asserted, had its origin somewhere around 50,000 B. C.
