Episcopalians Told Church Depends on Laity's Activity

NEW YORK (AP)—A severe arraignment of the laity of the Episcopal church for indifference to their religious obligations is contained in a report, made public today, of the Commission on Increased Lay Activities, which will be submitted to the Episcopal Triennial General Convention at New Orleans October 7 to 12.

The adequate solution of the problem of maintaining and increasing the active and effective interest of the laity in the work of the church is essential to the continuance of the life of the church, it said.

Without the enlistment of the active enthusiasm, without the real and the employment of the missionary impulses of the laity, the church must, inexorably, live a stunted and halting life.

The committee points to the fact that with the exception of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew, the Episcopal church has notably neglected the field of lay activity.

There can be no denial, says the report, that the Episcopal church has not actively and intensively gone about the task of organizing and inspiring and applying the energies of its laymen, as a whole, for the work of the church, as a whole, and, second, that both by reason, by history and

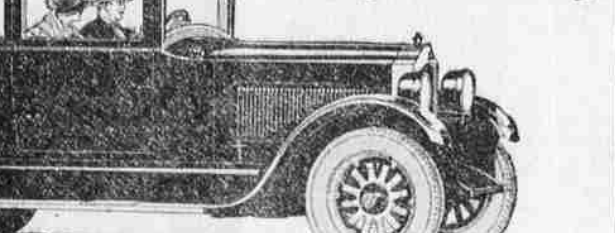
