Sister Mary Says:

Breakfast—Stewed prunes, cereal, thin cream, bread crumbs, omelet, toast, milk, coffee.

Luncheon—Baked ham, bean bread, currant jelly, drop cookies, milk, tea.

Dinner—Vegetable soup, 10-12 sticks, egg salad, whole wheat bread, caramel custard with fruit sauce, apple milk, coffee.

This day's menu is planned for a day when the entire family is at home for the noon meal. The evening meal is light, easily prepared but nourishing.

Left-over meat can be used in the baked hash if convenient.

Baked Hash
One-half pound round steak ground, 1 cup chopped carrots, 1 cup chopped potatoes, 2 medium-sized onions, 1 cup milk, 1 teaspoon salt, 1-4 teaspoon pepper, 1-2 cup dried bread crumbs, 4 tablespoons buttered crumbs.

Mix meats and dried bread crumbs thoroughly. The vegetables should be put through the food chopper. Combine vegetables and meat mixture. Season with salt and pepper and put into a well-buttered baking dish. Pour over-milk and cover with buttered crumbs. Cover dish and bake in a slow oven for one hour. Remove cover to crisp and brown the crumbs. Serve in the baking dish.

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Picture Show Tricks by Which Madrid Beguines Deceive People

MADRID (AP)—Street lighting here is on the increase and the efforts of the authorities to suppress it have been frustrated by the too glib public who give liberal alms to the beggars.

The authorities have now, however, issued a photograph in the press which they hope may have the effect of putting an end to what has been described as a nuisance. In this picture a number of beggars are shown before and after their admittance to the asylum reserved for beggars. In one the men are shown in a very pitiable condition, blind, paralytic and one apparently with one leg.

In the other the photograph shows the same men erect and apparently quite normal, the missing leg having been unfettered from its hiding place. The pictures, it was pointed out, are merely proof of the ease with which the amazing beggars in Madrid are tricked.
