LONDON (AP)—A scheme for the establishment of hospitals, training gardens and other institutions for the welfare of the native populations has been launched in commemoration of the approaching birthday of General Bramwell Booth, of the Salvation Army.

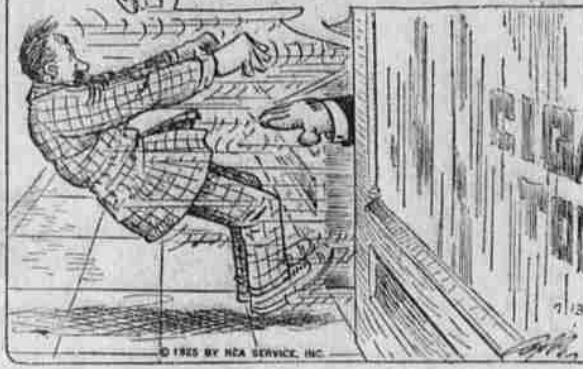
A world-wide appeal has achieved such response as to ensure the erection of buildings costing \$1,000,000. Half this amount will be spent in India and Ceylon and the erection of two industrial village houses, a large hospital for lepers, and a central hall in the city of Calcutta is contemplated.

Other countries sharing in the extension are China, Japan, Korea, West Indies, Dutch East Indies, South Africa and Kenya Colony.

## New Mission Hospital

Dedicated at Poochow. Poochow (AP).—A well equipped hospital erected in memory of Dr. Kate C. Woodhull, has been dedicated in Poochow by the women's board of missions of the Congregational church. Built of gray brick in semi-Chinese style, it is one of the most attractive mission buildings in the city. The plans call for a total investment of about \$50,000, which has been contributed almost entirely by women of the New York branch.

The building is located on ground adjacent to the men's hospital of the Congregational church making the work of the American board mission a complete unit and giving Poochow what it has long needed, a good hospital for women under foreign supervision.

Dr. L. M. Dyer is in charge with Miss Hazel Atwood, R. N., head of the nursing staff. The plant was built by the Pookien construction bureau.
