can record in China has been good—almost unprecedented in its history, for a whole people—due largely to the influence still felt after his death, of John Hay, as secretary of state.

Now's the time to cash in on this. At such juncture, it is too much to say that a pro-Japanese minister at Peking, a pro-Jap ambassador at Tokyo would be a different thing, but a pro-Japanese minister at Peking—and a pro-British secretary of state in Washington, are an unfortunate combination?

Of course it may turn out all right, but are those two the ideal pick?

An anchor to the windward for the United States in a rather stormy state of affairs is the chairman of the Senate committee on foreign relations, William E. Borah.

Nothing's so bad but it might have been worse. If we hadn't had Borah!

He's expressed himself concerning China freely, and with what he said no patriotic Chinese—or American—can find a word of fault.

Pro-British and pro-Japanese will be careful at least, with Borah on the job.

And does anybody recall that Borah all along has urged recognition of Russia, too? It would be mighty handy—if it had been done—right now.

### Japan Has Trouble Providing Food Enough for Population

TOKYO (AP)—The food and population problem still continues the most serious one confronting Japan. At a recent meeting of high officials of the Department of Agriculture and Forestry it was decided that the government should revise the regulations for opening up and bringing land under cultivation.

The officials were of the opinion that there are considerable areas in Hokkaido and Korea which might be opened up and tilled if proper encouragement were offered settlers. It was stated that while the area of land in Japan and the volume of foodstuffs have been materially increased, the rate of increase has begun to fall off lately and is not keeping pace with the increase of population.

Consequently, additional inducements are to be offered settlers in the districts which are still open to cultivation.
